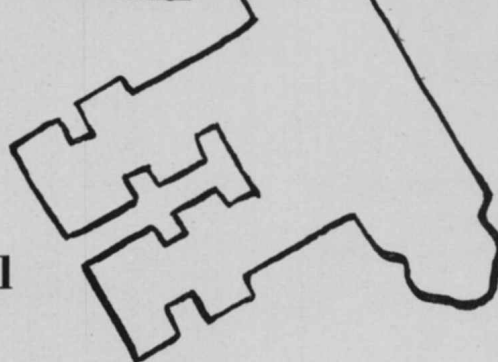

Building For The Future . . .

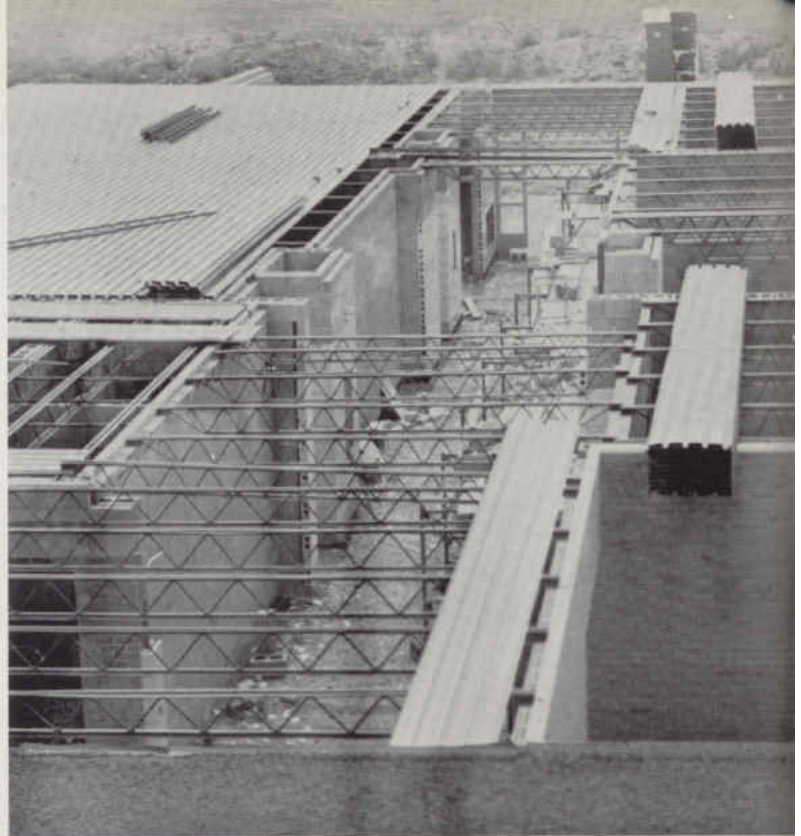
Building is a frequent activity at Streetsboro High School. In its two years of existence, building has gone on not only in the form of construction, but in the enrichment of education, the forming of individual character, and the development of spirit.

In this first issue we have tried to show how this all helps to make up a well-rounded school of which we are proud to be a part. We present to you the 1964 *Golden Key*.

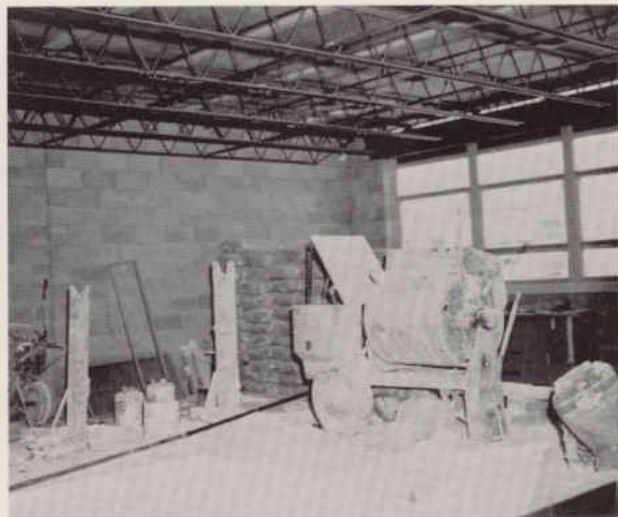
Streetsboro High School is located on a thirty-two acre site at the end of Wienczek Road away from any major highway. The architects, Hunter, Howard, and Saxon, began the building early in 1962, and it was completed in time to begin classes for the 1962-1963 school year. It contained classrooms which provided for the offering of a comprehensive program to meet the needs of 450 students. The total cost of the land and improvements, the construction, and equipment, came to approximately \$868,000.

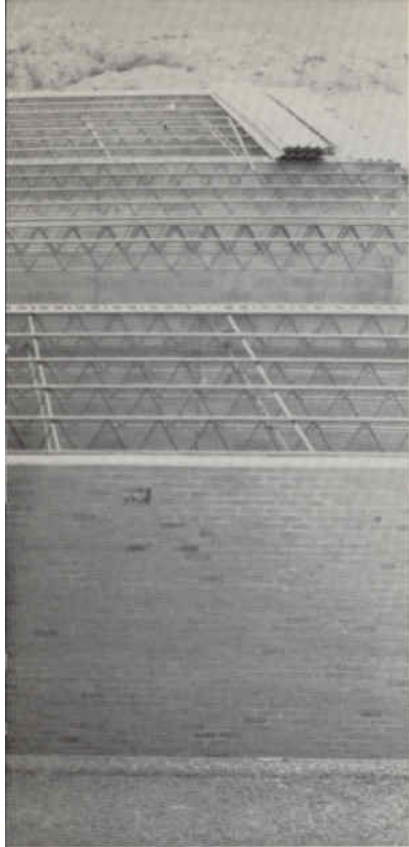
In the spring of 1963 construction was begun on an addition to help house the rapidly growing student body. Hunter, Howard, and Saxon again served as the architects. The building was completed by November at a cost of \$178,000. Among its many features were a tri-level library, a developmental reading laboratory, a biology laboratory with its own greenhouse, an art room, a lecture hall which may be used for team teaching, and three conventional classrooms.

At a total cost of over \$1,000,000 Streetsboro now has a modern, efficient high school, which will accommodate approximately 600 students.

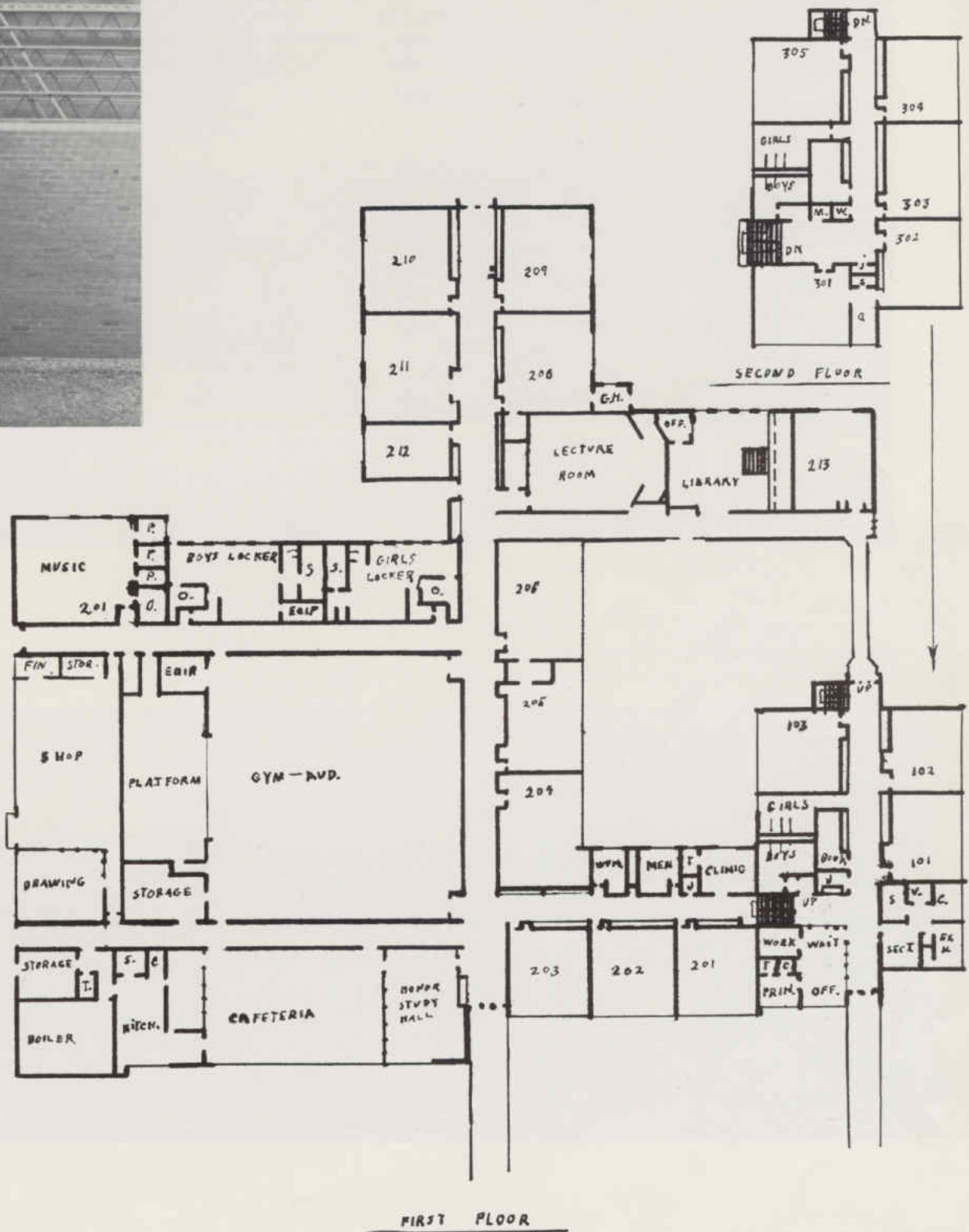


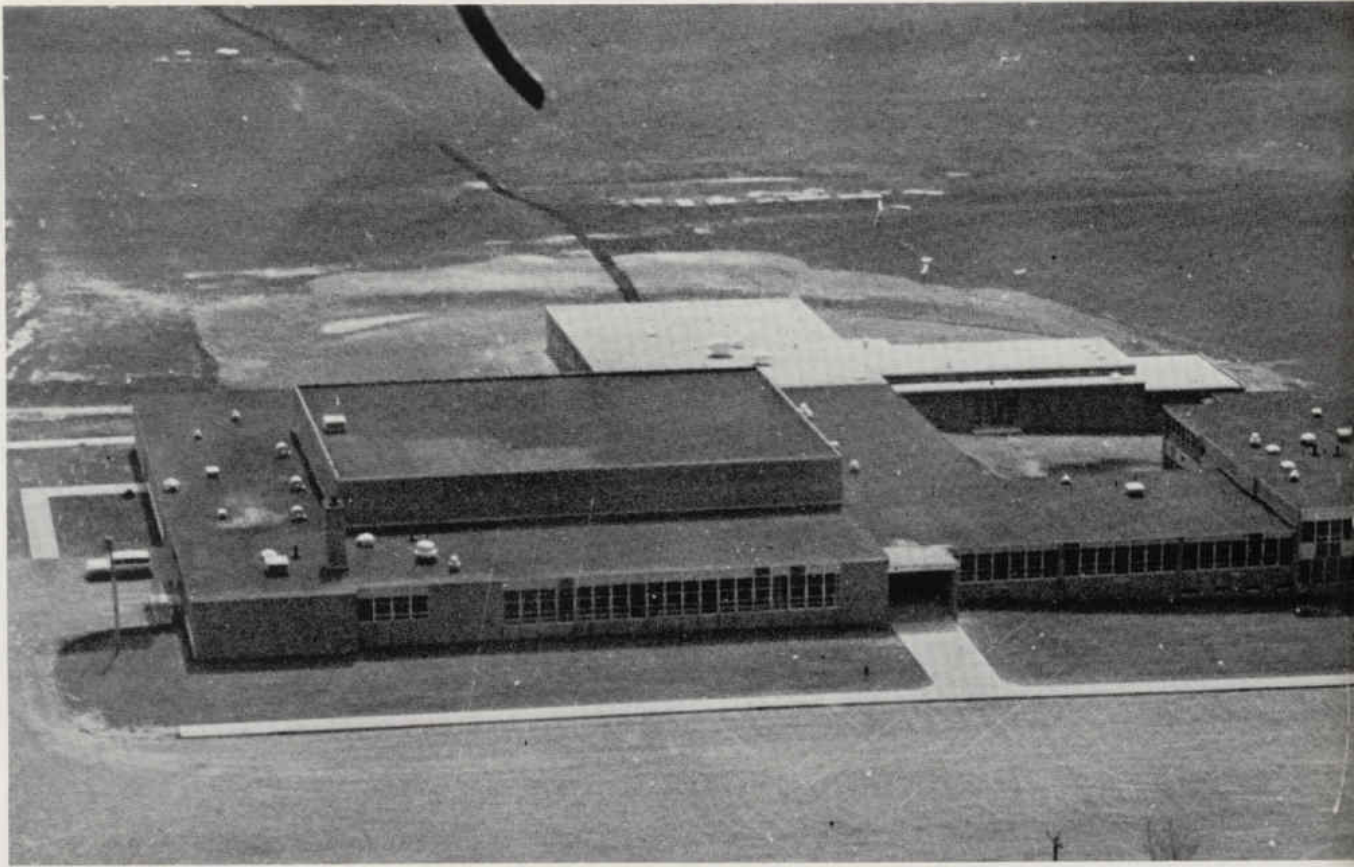

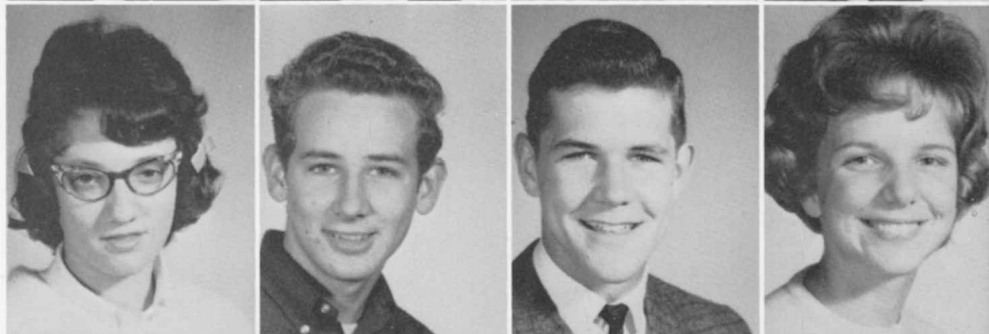
Juniors Pave Way With Gold

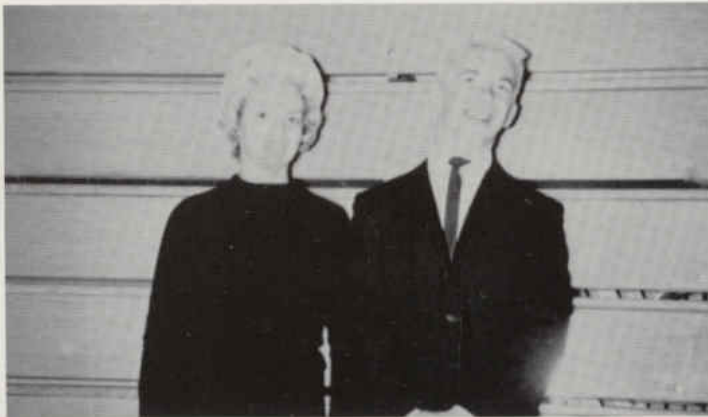
This year the Booster Club was responsible for decorating the school. Their Christmas project was collecting food for the needy.

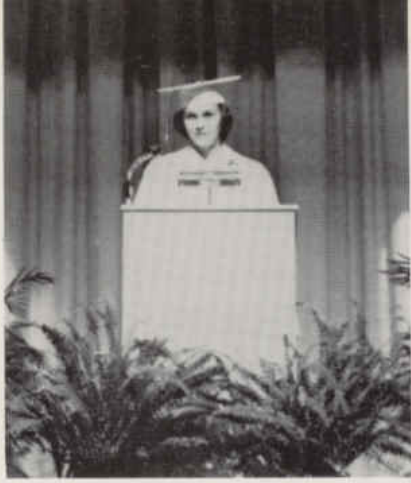
