

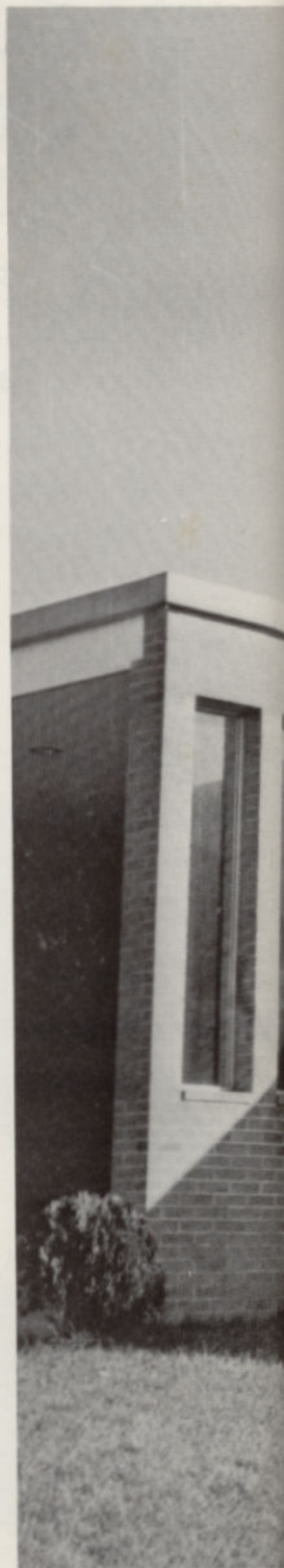




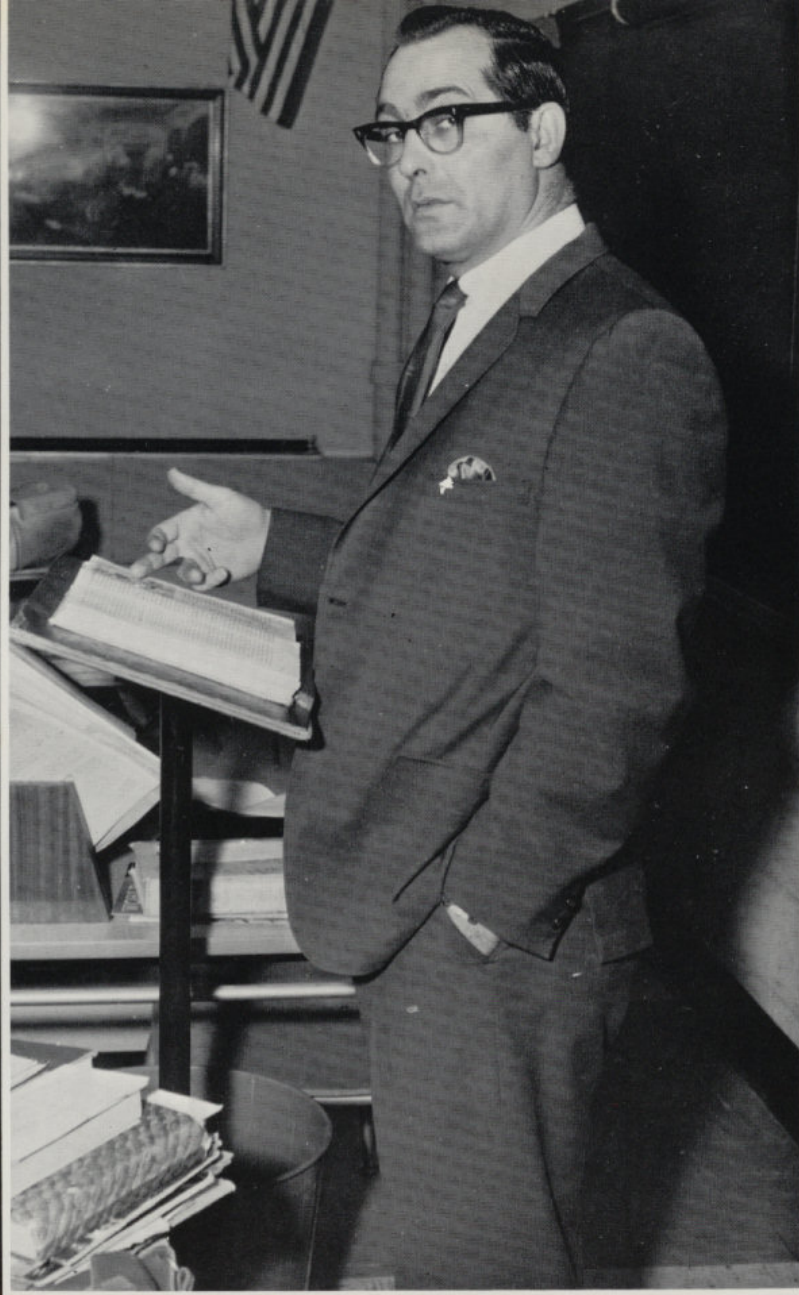
Another year has passed and although life will never again be exactly the same, the same events will continue to take place. There will still be the dances, the games, the other numerous activities . . .

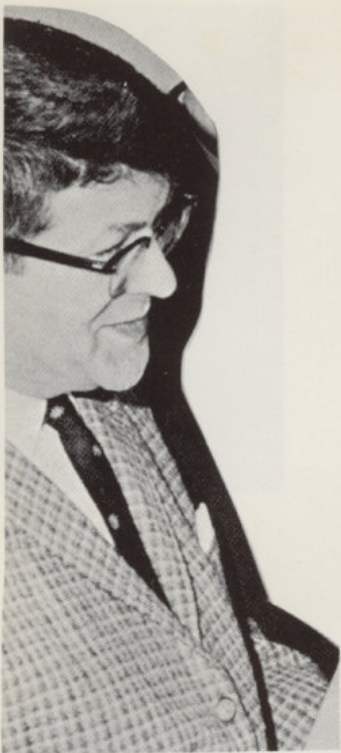
Dear Seniors,

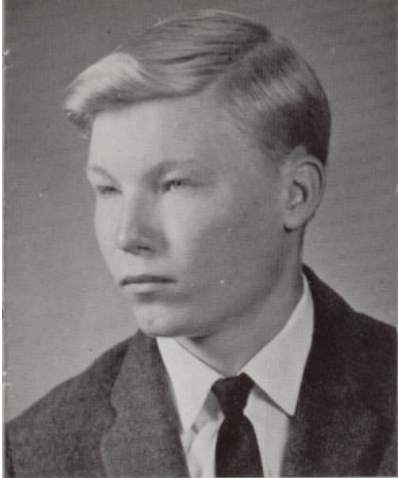


Priceless Memories
