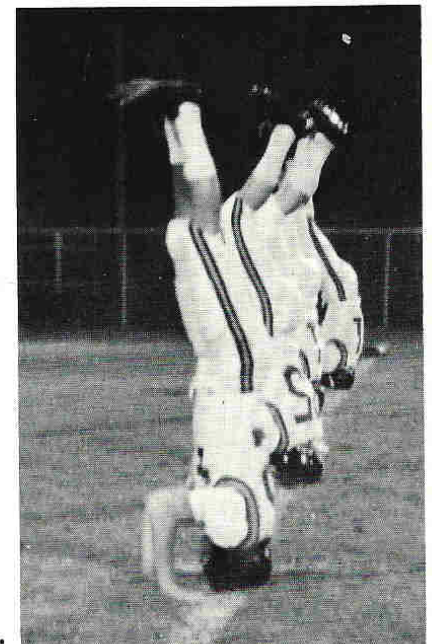

The Streetsboro Rockets 1973 football season went rather well, with the Rockets capturing the winning side of a 7-2-1 record. Although falling short of first place, the Rockets did tie with the best log ever for a Streetsboro football team, while also tying for second place in the county. A side effect of the 1973 season was to awaken a sense of school spirit and pride, which was sadly lacking in years previous.

The fans were not slighted either, for the Rockets provided them with many exciting games and plenty of fast action, topping 40 points on two different occasions. An early snow caught the Rockets, on their closing game, which was played in a foot of the white stuff. All in all, it was a great season providing much promise for next year.

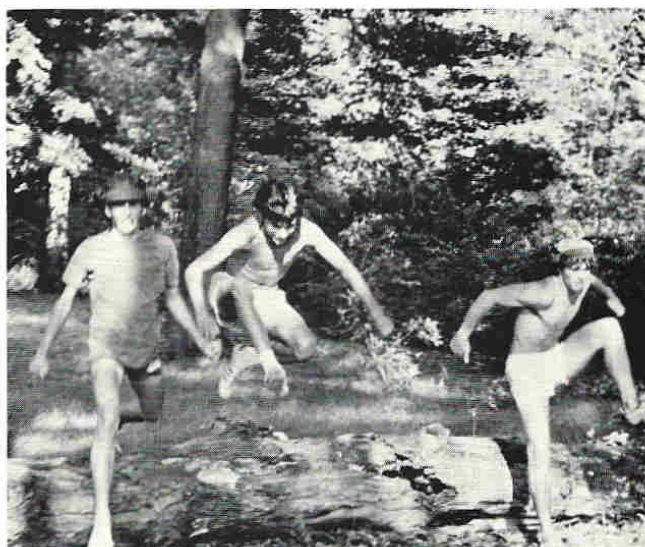

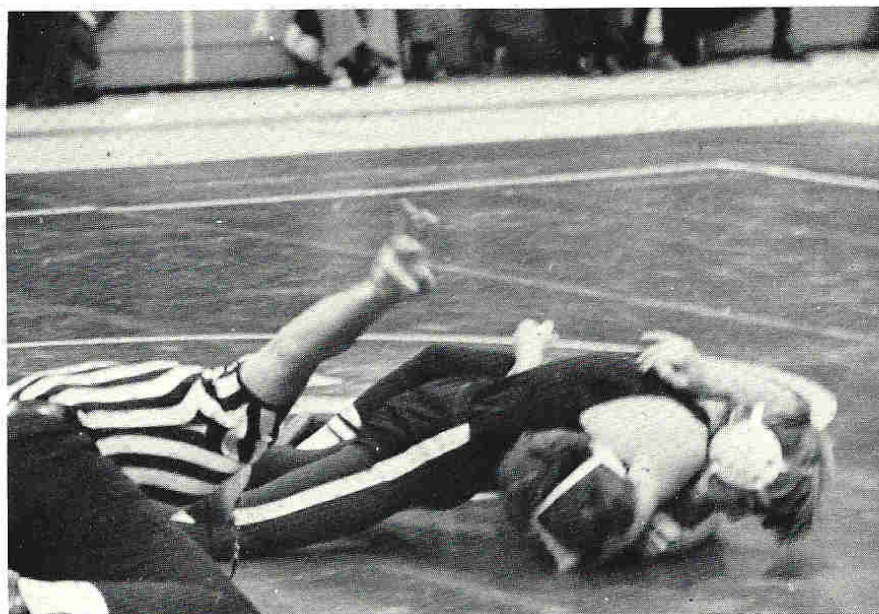
The Streetsboro Rockets dropped their first two league matches, much to the chagrin of first year coach Larry Marek. However, showing their character, the Rockets came back to win four of their next five bouts, ending the season with a league record of 4-3, and an overall dual-meet record of 7-6. Under the leadership of senior co-captains Jeff Lilly, Dennis Kline, Dan Aiken, and Jim Grubaugh, the Rockets went on to break six team records and also to register the first winning dual-meet record since 1968.

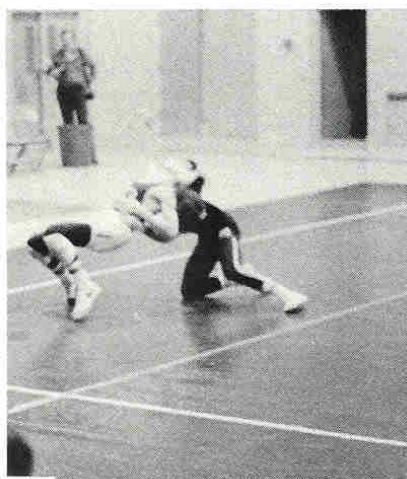

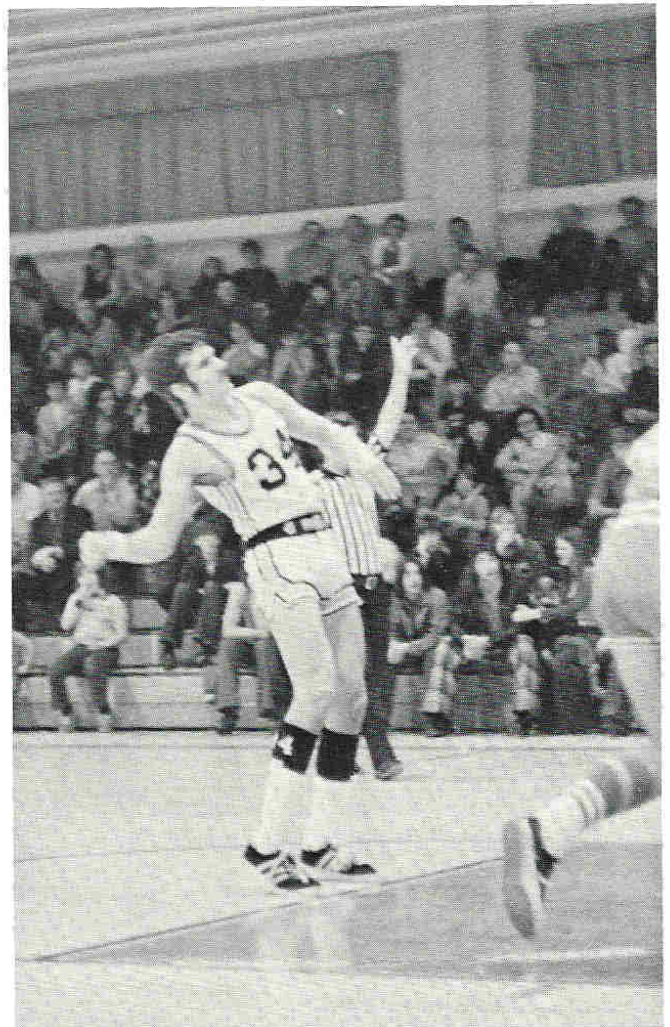

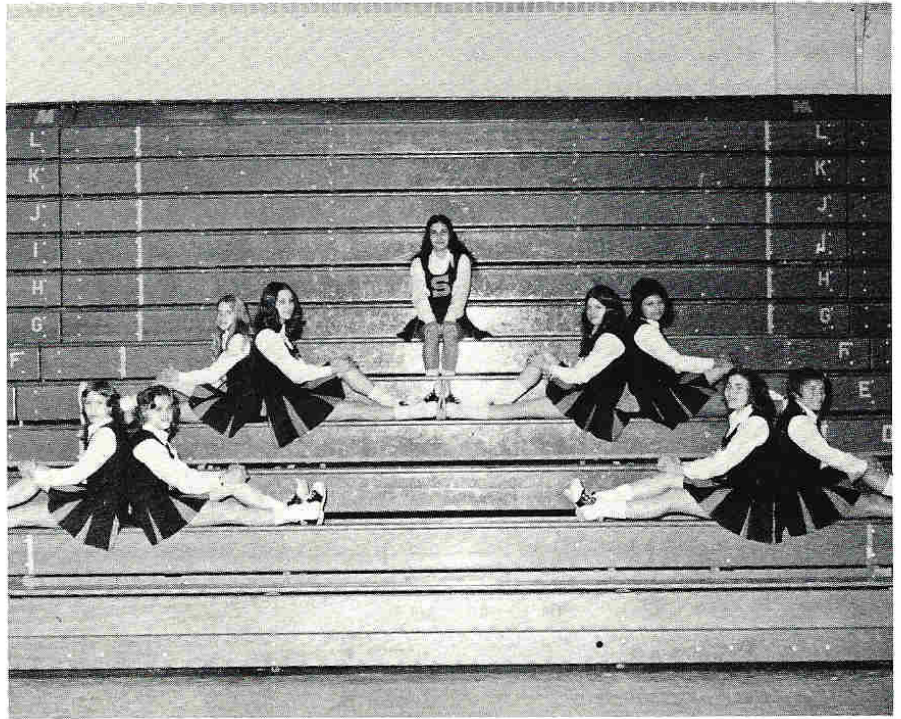
