The tassel turns from right to left while "Good luck - you cannot fail" echoes all around.









Bright Promise for Future


The 1974 football season did not go as well as expected, with the Rockets eventually sporting a 4-6 mecord. Having no exceptionally large gridders to work with, head coach Tom Sladky went with a two-platoon system, thereby enabling the Rockets to memain fresh while battling with teams averaging up to 30 lbs. per person more. The Rockets got off to a show start, but eventually began to gain momentum, climaxed by a new school rushing record for one game set by Tom Lewis (243 Yds.) en route to a 32-8 momp over Waterloo. Being a young team, Streetsboro fans can look forward to a powerful team in the future. Many sophomores and even freshmen gained useful varsity experience this year, ending the season with bright promise for the future.






Float Competition Sets Off

The Streetsboro Rockets posted a fine 7-3 record to close the 1974-75 season, while ending up 5-2 in the league, outscoring their opponents 365 to 186. Their only losses in the tough schedule were to the Metro League Champs and the PCL Champs and runner-up. In tournament action, the Rockets competed in the Hudson Tourney, and were nosed out of second place by one point in the final bout by Akron South, taking third in a field of 14 teams, including 6 AAA schools. Streetsboro captured 7 medals, including one champ. In the PCL Tournament, the Rockets repeated last year's performance by placing 12 boys in the league. Although there were no champs, they did have 6 runners-up while taking third in the league with 88 1/2 points, more than any other Streetsboro team in history. In the Sectionals, the Rockets once again took second, but still managed to shatter a school record by qualifying 10 wrestlers for Districts. The Districts saw Streetsboro place 19th of 49 teams, and one wrestler, Jerome Pavlick, missing a berth in the coveted State Tourney by two points.











1975 Baseball Season









The 1975 baseball team, under the reins of head coach Gary Huber, rounded up the season with a log of 7-13 overall and 2-5 in the league. Pitching was the strong point, with the honors going to co-captain John Teece and Mark Swiger. Hitting, however, proved to be the team's downfall, for the Rockets lacked overall batting power. The best batting average belonged to Chris Zack with a .283 average. Defense will need improvement for next year, but shows promise. The absence of Most Valuable Player John Teece will be felt, but all together only three seniors will be leaving. A young team with Rookie of the Year Jack Adams and the improved pitching of Mark Swiger and hopefuls Chris Zack and Greg Rice may prove bright for next year.




Brainpower Spurs Honors, Competition
