





















As Air Sound Command was being booked for parties, Russ bought new equipment and new records. Top 40 isn't the only thing he plays, but also golden oldies and country music.




Ray Hapeman is being featured this year for his help in the plays (with electronics) and for being outstanding in the field of science.

His favorite class he says is Chemistry, and his hobby is electronics. He feels that his greatest accomplishment has been receiving his novice license.


His plans for the future are to go to Akron University and study Electrical Engineering. His goal is to be just that: an Electronic Engineer.

The Streetsboro school district can be grateful for having such devoted citizens in its midst such as these two very fine people.





Records: Mile, 2 miles, and 2 1/2 miles here at the High School, as well as holding 3 records at the Junior High.






Pat Jones-Caring For Others.




"I feel great when I go there. It is a whole different world," stated Hattie Larlham volunteer, Pat Jones.





John said his interest in juggling is only for fun. He does not plan to make it his career. But, who knows, he may "juggle" his plans.












There aren't many people who have the natural ability to draw, but Kenneth Michael Granville is one person who has that ability.

When asked what made them interested in volunteering Joyce Marks said, "My Mom influenced me to start volunteering. Now, I am interested


in making a future out of it."






Steve Foltin-Friend, Teacher, And Radio Manager


