





I.C.C. International Culture Club




Harvey Craig








Coming On Strong







International Culture Club Plans Trip To Europe!



loon-A-Fair Parade. They received other awards throughout the year including a third place trophy from the Blossom Festival Parade in Niagara Falls, Canada.



For example, this year, the class donated and built a varsity basketball lockerroom for the Athletic program.


At the close of the school year, 10 of the students in the class were employed. Mr. Truman works with employers to improve the students work and sometimes to help them find a job.




—Exchange Students Share Culture, Ideas—



Good luck Marilda and Francione! We miss you and may your memories of us all be the fondest ever.









Personhood Week was a huge sucess. Mayor Victor Pavlick even proclaimed "Personhood Week" for the entire city.










