


#### CHRISTMAS DANCE A SUCCESS


Tina Guinto said, "I think the gym was nicely decorated, and I really had a good time." The F.T.A. raised money for a scholarship given at the end of the year.


# SHARING THEIR LIVES ...


The 1983/84 FNA consisted of students with hopes of becoming doctors, nurses, or volunteers.



"I liked getting out of school after just a half a day," said Ken Biltz.


"If it wasn't for this class, I would probably not be in school," said Ken Holcomb.






"It was something you can never do again that's very worthwhile," stated senior Mike Szabo. He was awarded a wrestling scholarship to Kent State University.

Junior John Purcell said his favorite part of the trip was going out to eat for every meal.




Although meeting all the time requirements is difficult, he feels the students make up for it. He particularly likes the seniors as a class the most, but all the classes are well liked.


### Science Club Goes To Canada



Transportation around Toronto was always different. Sometimes we would ride in the vans, on trolleys, and on subways. Trolleys and subways were a new experience for everyone.








