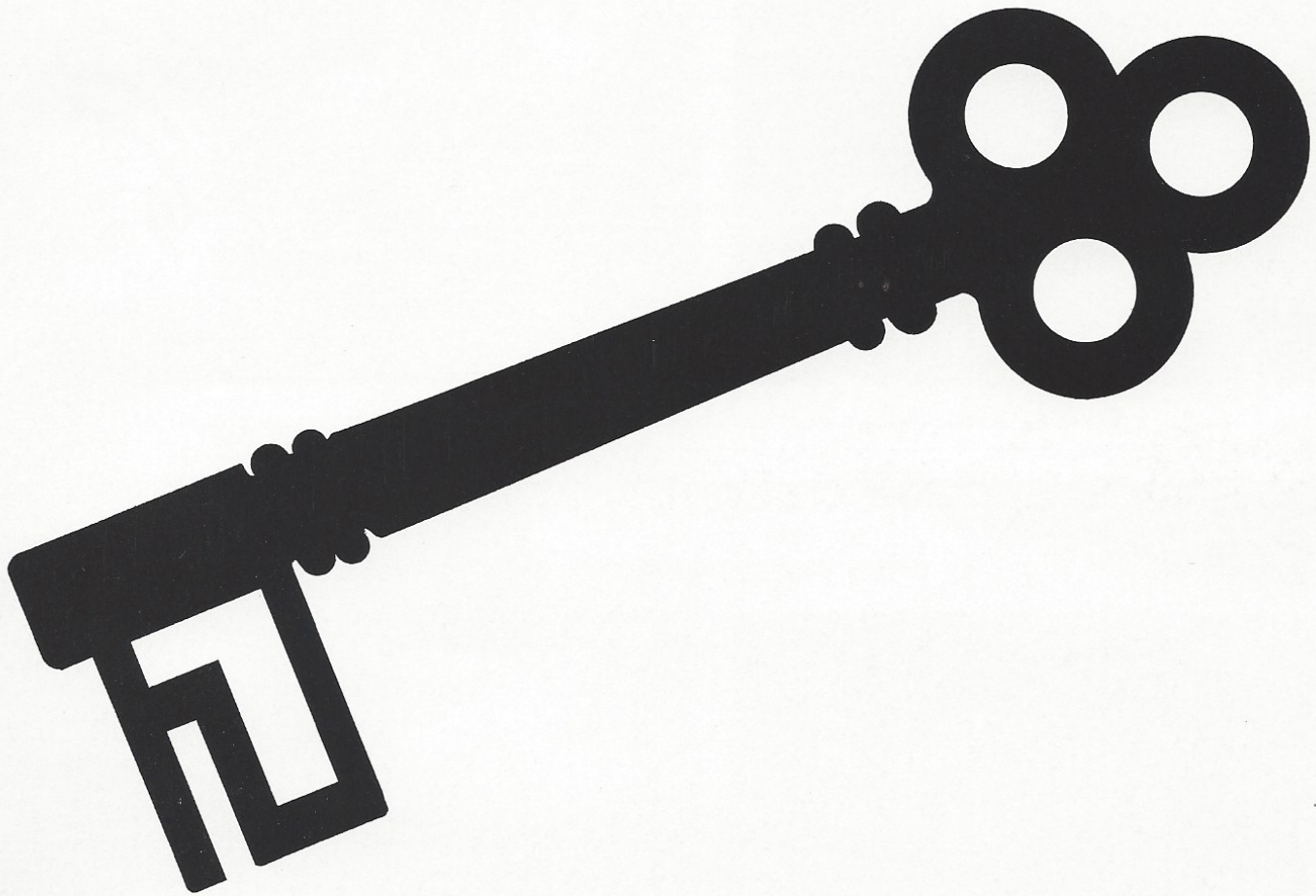

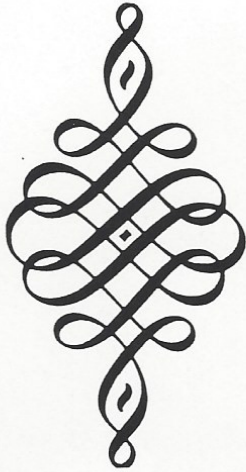

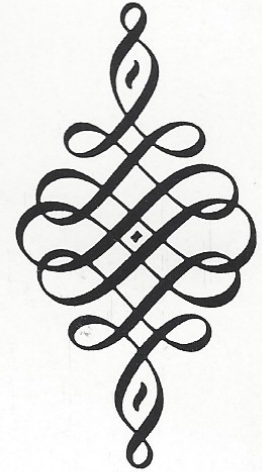
Cobwebs covering the thoughts of our past.

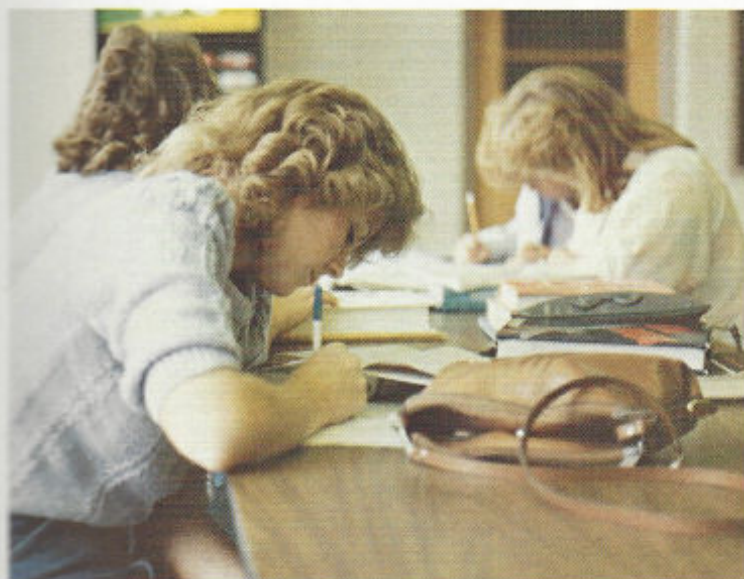

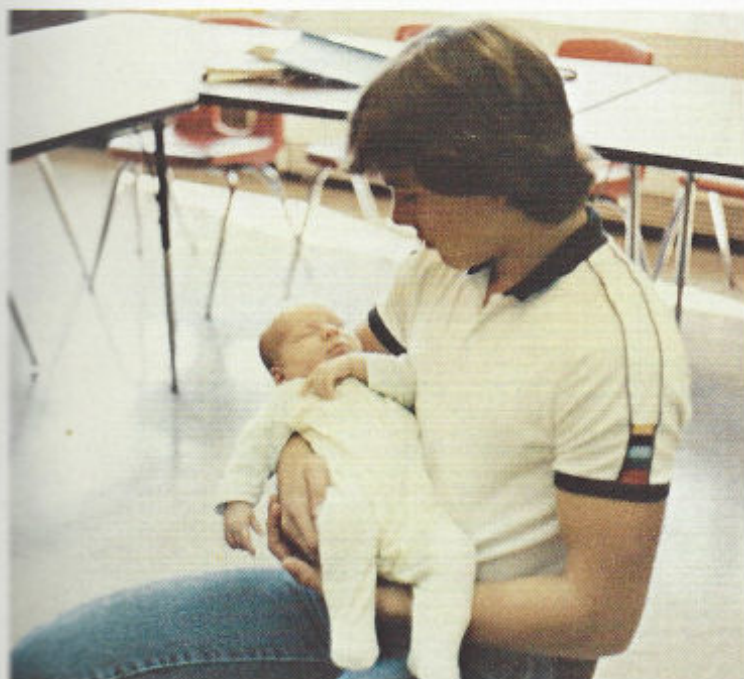


# FIRST DAY PROVIDES A VARIETY OF HAPPENINGS



Atty Hicks desperately works to get the English assignment done in boring study hall; one of the highlights at Streetsboro High School.

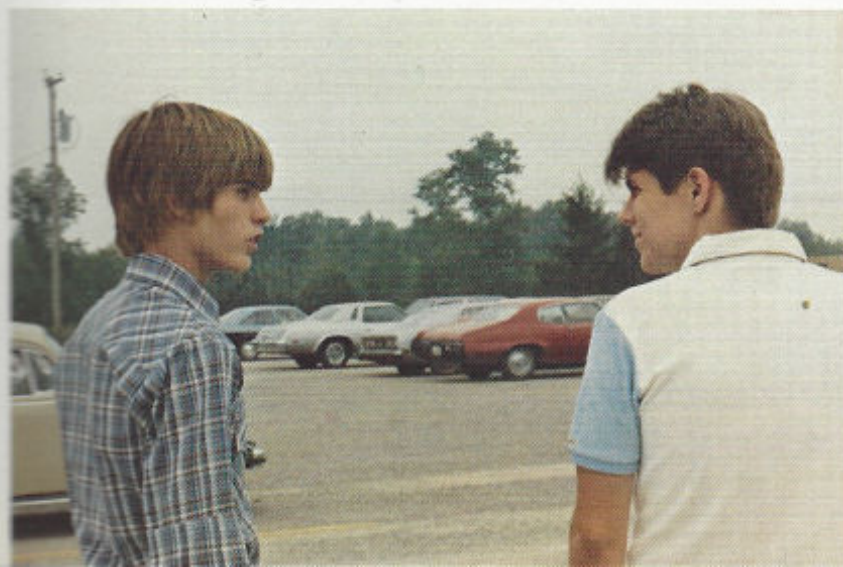
Pam Baillie seems to be very unenthusiastic as she goes into the library to see what kind of exciting books she can come up with.

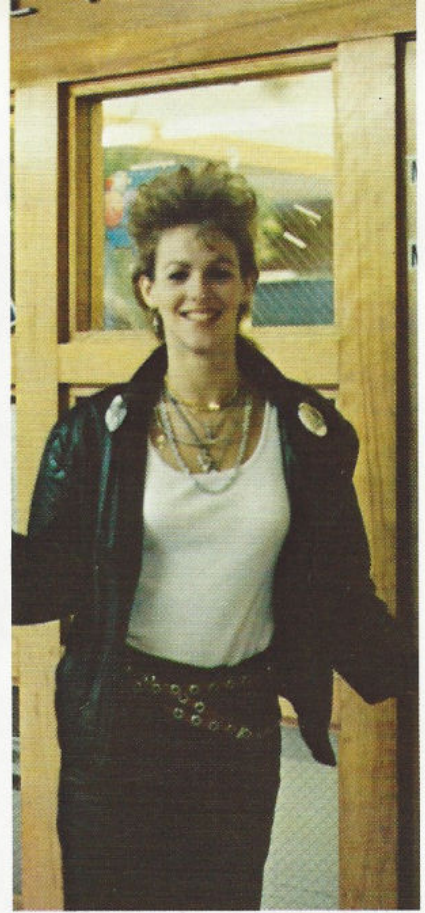

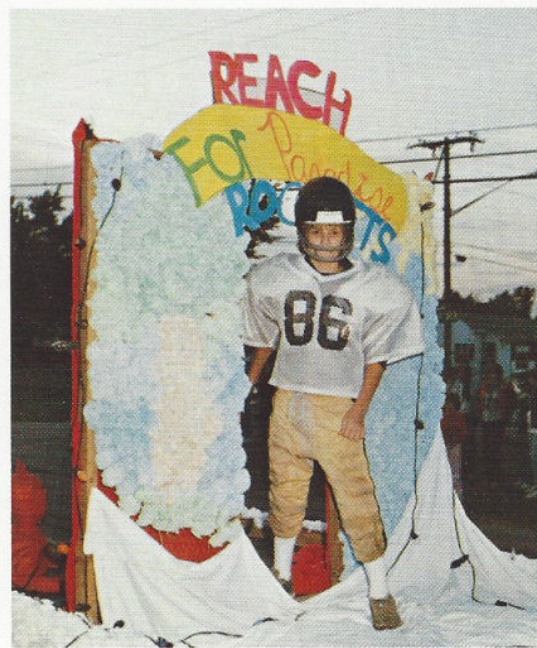

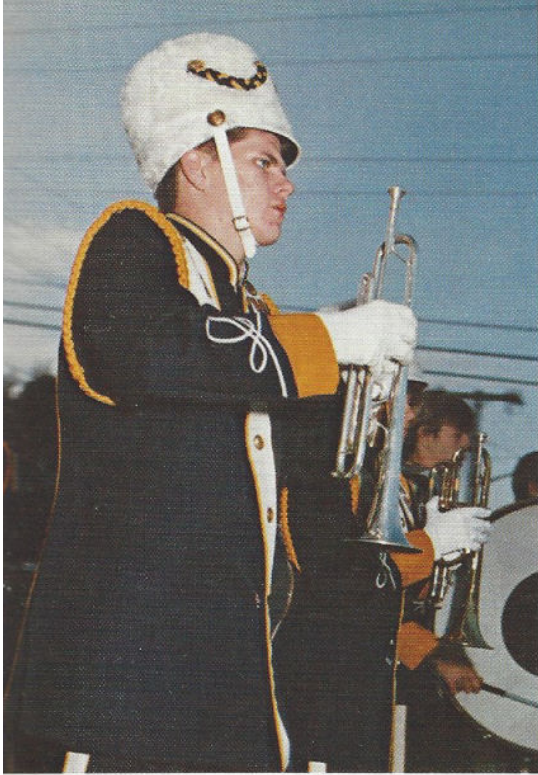

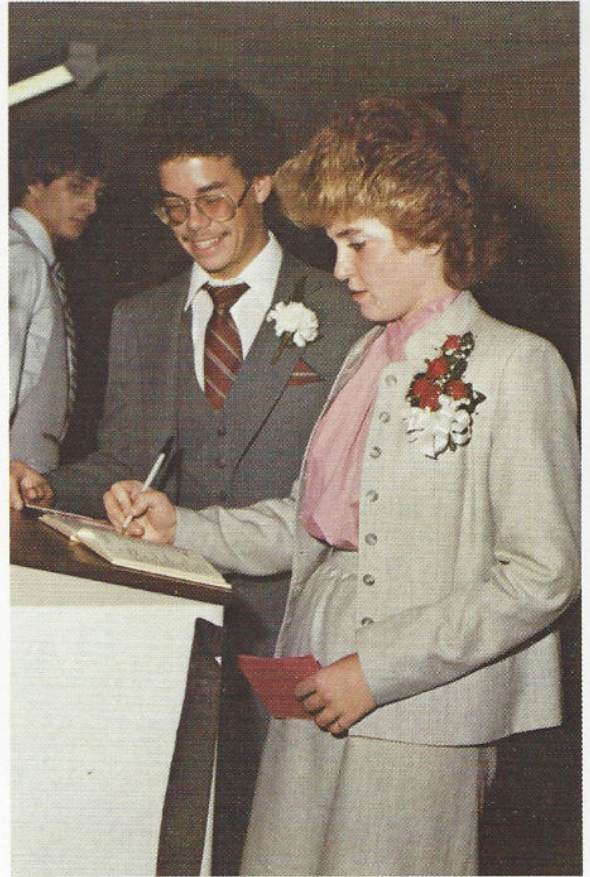

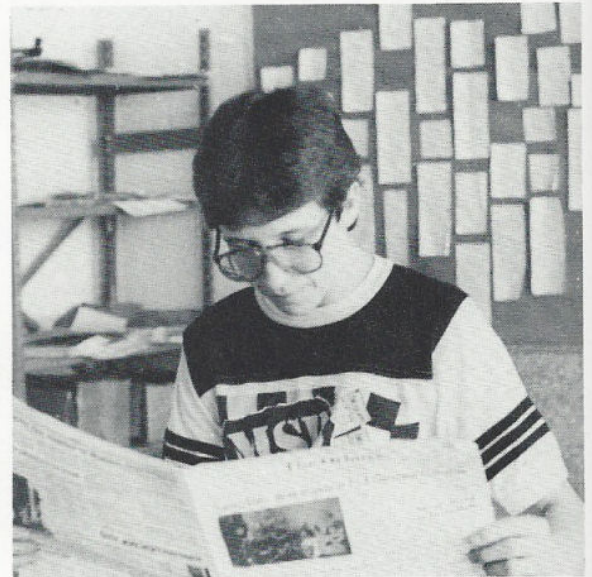

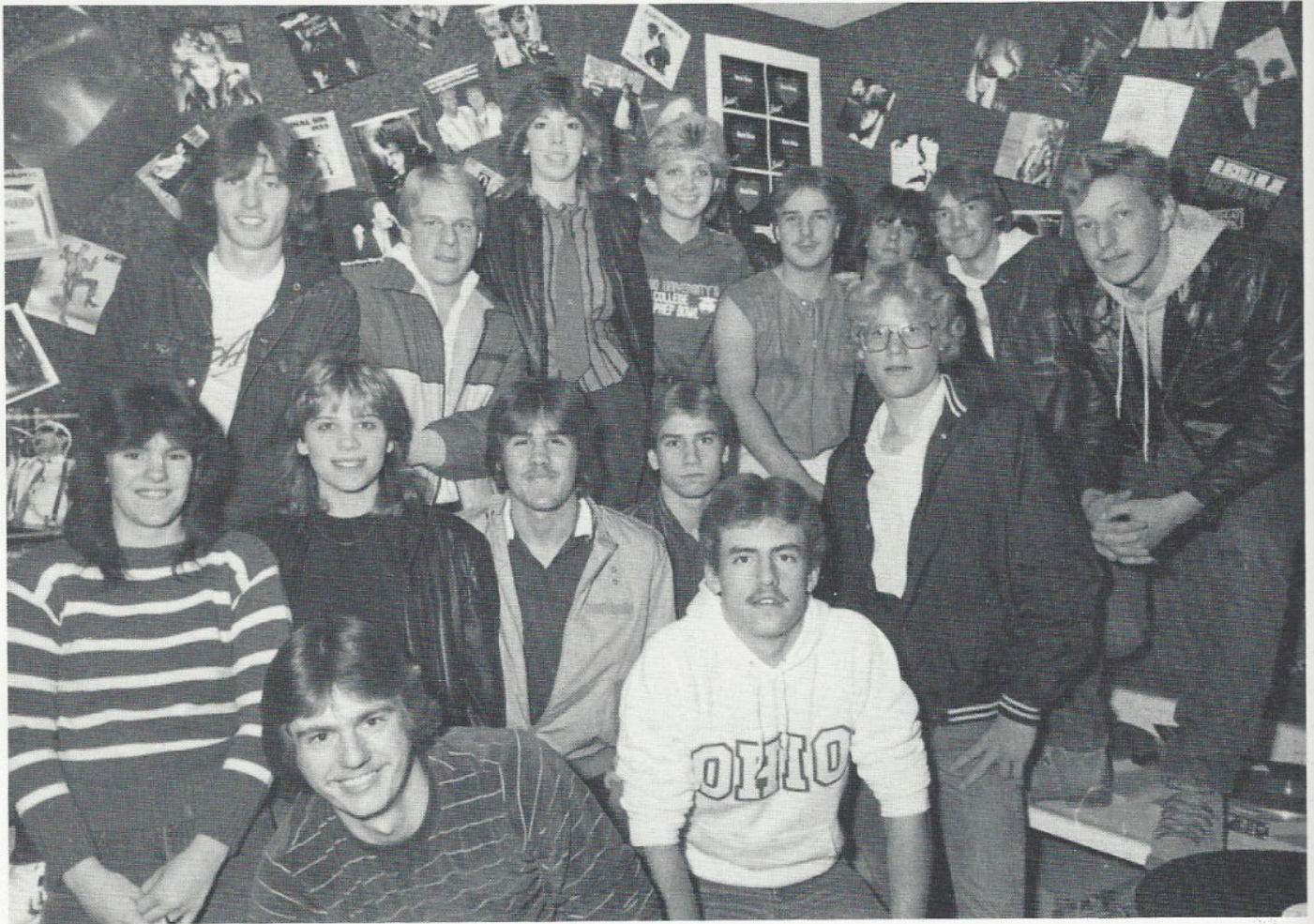

WSTB is Streetsboro's own 330-watt FM radio station. It is run by juniors and seniors with help of Bob Long. The 17 members have various jobs. There are eight disc jockeys, and three news reporters. Other jobs include operation's manager, music director, engineer, and promotion manager.

The station is the only one of its kind in Streetsboro. It is located at 91.5 FM. The station is owned by the Board of Education, and broadcasts from the Middle School.

WSTB is licensed by the FCC and is a commercial-free station. The format is Top 40 music. They also provide news, weather, and sports, including Streetsboro football, basketball, and baseball.

The station serves communities from Aurora to Kent-Ravenna and from Hudson to Mantua. We are very fortunate to be able to provide such an opportunity to our students. They do a fantastic job.

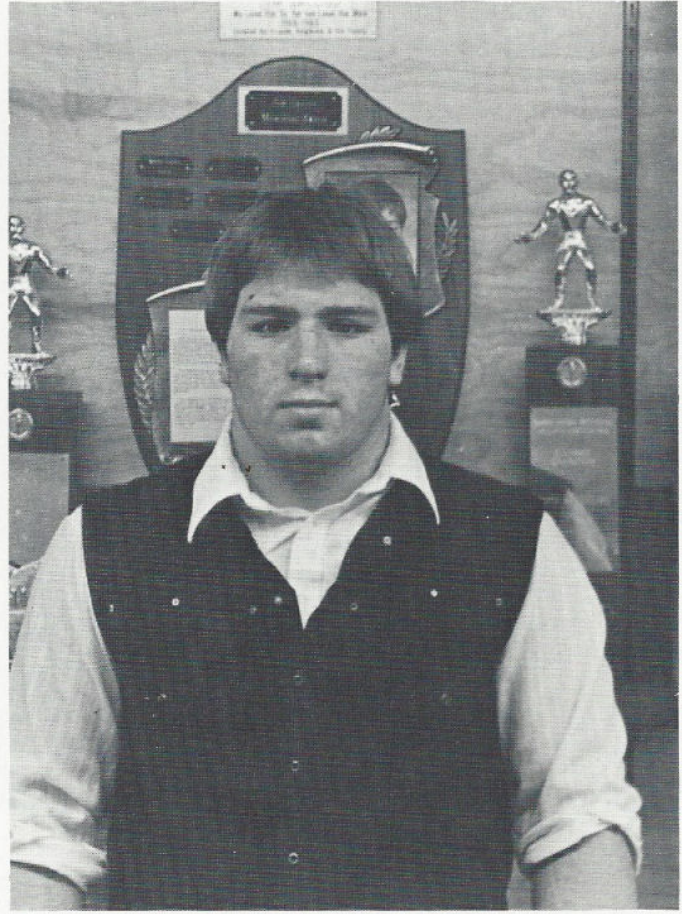

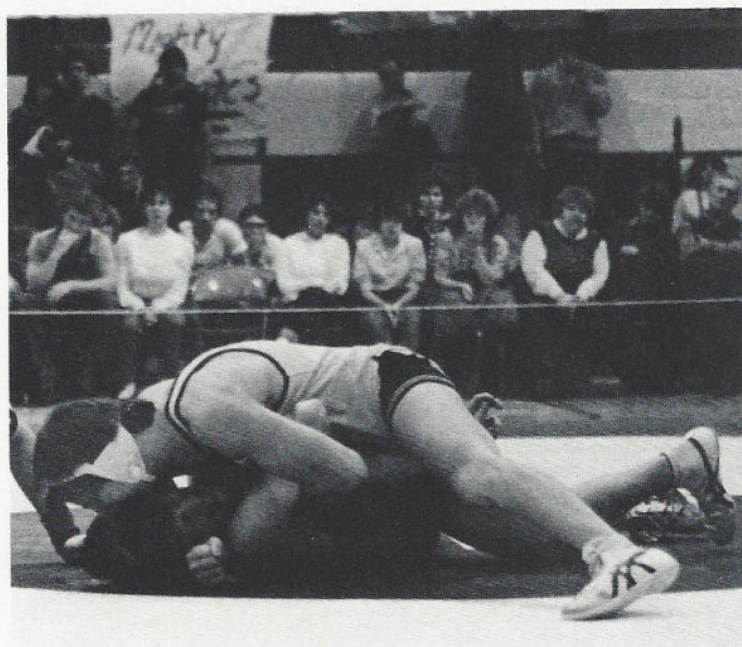

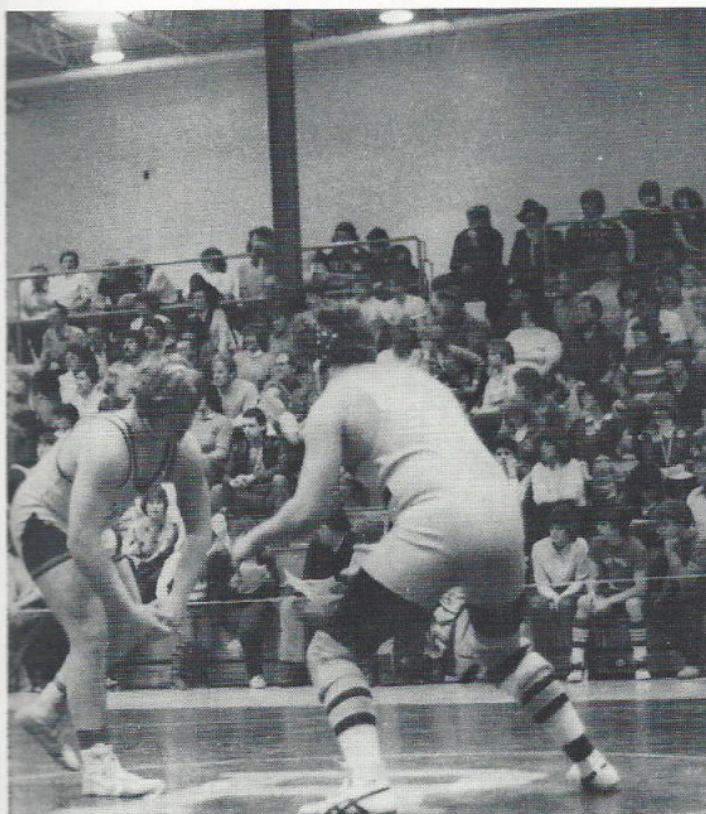

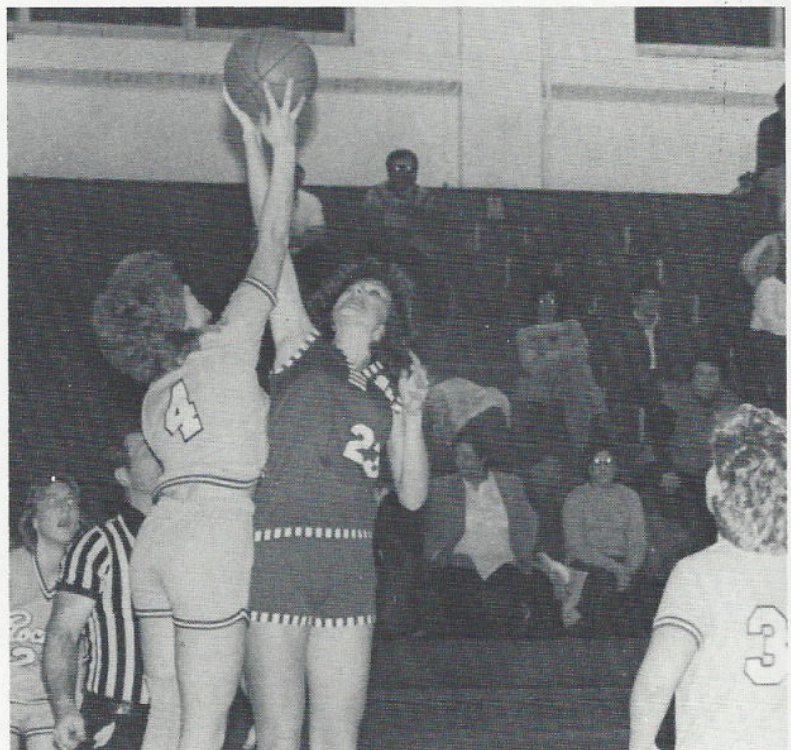

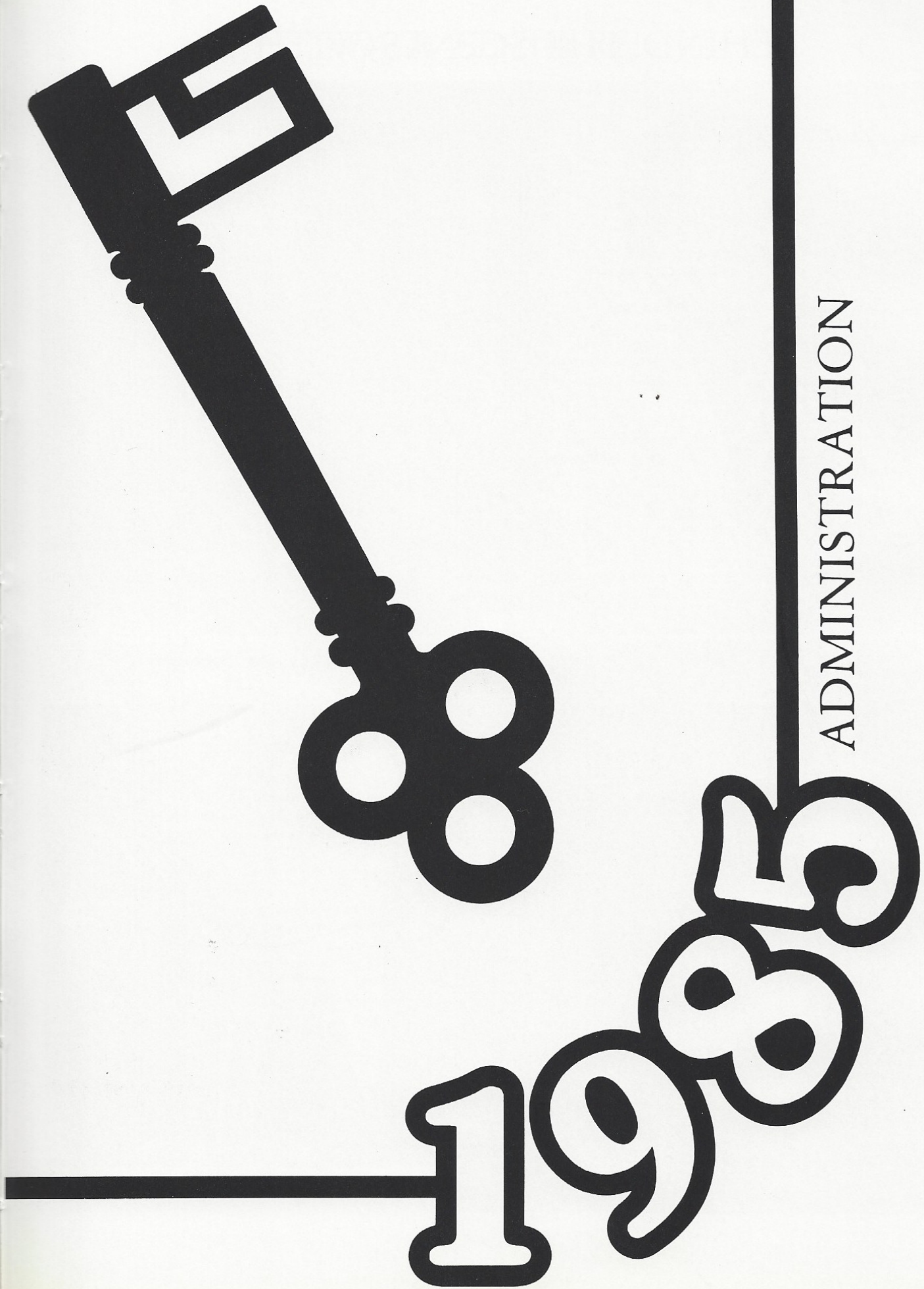

"I swear if this phone rings one more time, I'll lose my sanity!" Mrs. Dunlap says with a smile.

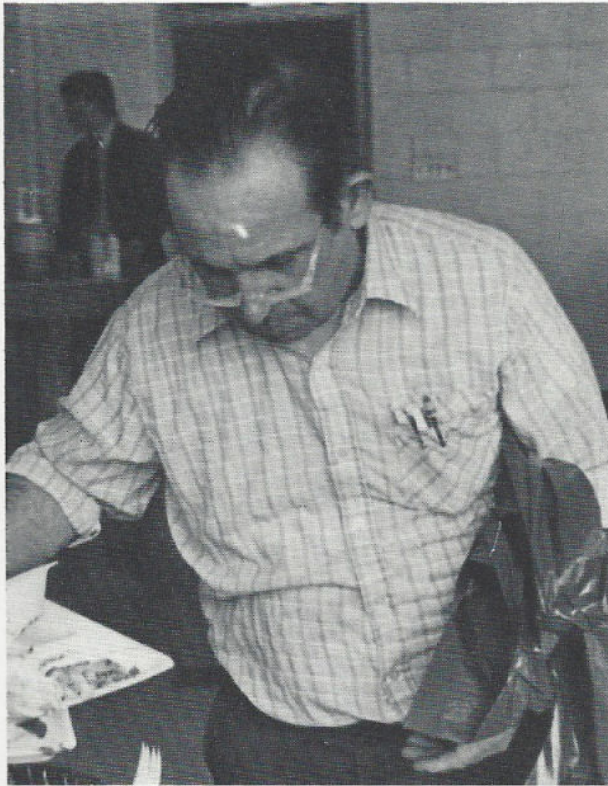

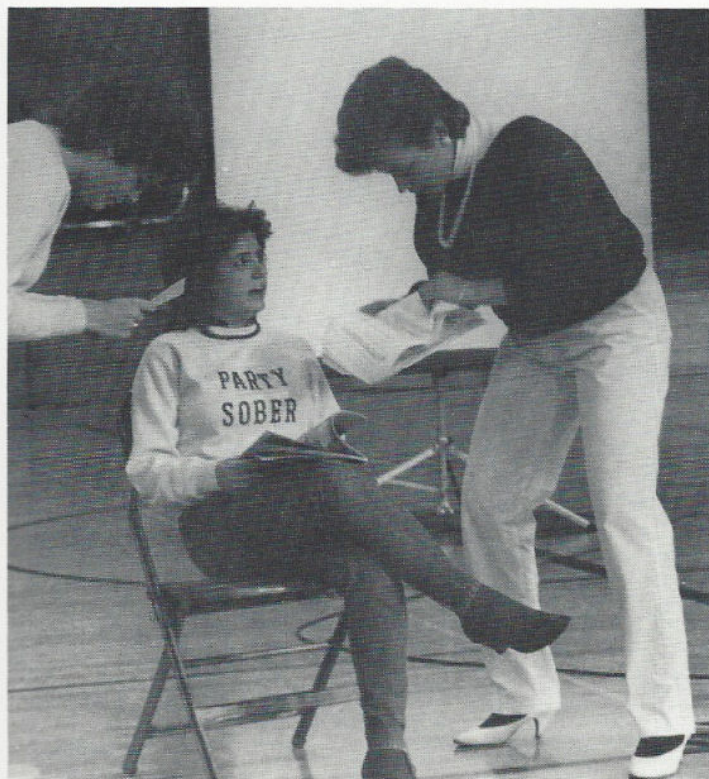
## T.I. SHOWS THEY CARE!
