
In general he'd like to run the school more efficiently. His ultimate goal is to see every senior graduate from high school.

The week before Homecoming was the most unique week of the year. As one looked around, there were some weird things to be seen. On each day of the week, students were encouraged to dress up for that day.



Thursday was, by tradition, 'Blue and Gold Day'. This was the most spirited day. All the football players wore their game uniforms and everyone was wearing our school colors.


The classes competed in hall decorating and spirit links. Most of the money raised from selling spirit links went to the United Way.


THE NEW NHS MEMBERS ON THEIR PROUDEST DAY

The induction was a candle-lit ceremony. Speeches were made by the officers and then senior members found and tapped the new inductees. After pictures, all the members went to the reception in the library.





The majority of participants played board games, varying from Trivial Pursuit to Black Tower. Others roller skated and watched movies.


Roughly 1,000 dollars was raised in the Marathon. One half of the money was donated to the class or organization of their choice.




A DISPLAY OF SCIENTIFIC KNOWLEDGE





TI did skits for younger students. They showed them that many older students don't take drugs.

















ROCKET FOOTBALL GOING STRONG IN 1985 SEASON!!










