

After the crowning, most of the seniors left and went to Quinn's, the Homecoming tradition, in Solon.



Kenny started taking lessons in the seventh grade, at Streetsboro Music. He got his first set of drums from his parents.


Kenny's dream is to make it "BIG". "Whenever I'm at a concert, I always say to myself — that's going to be us someday."


































