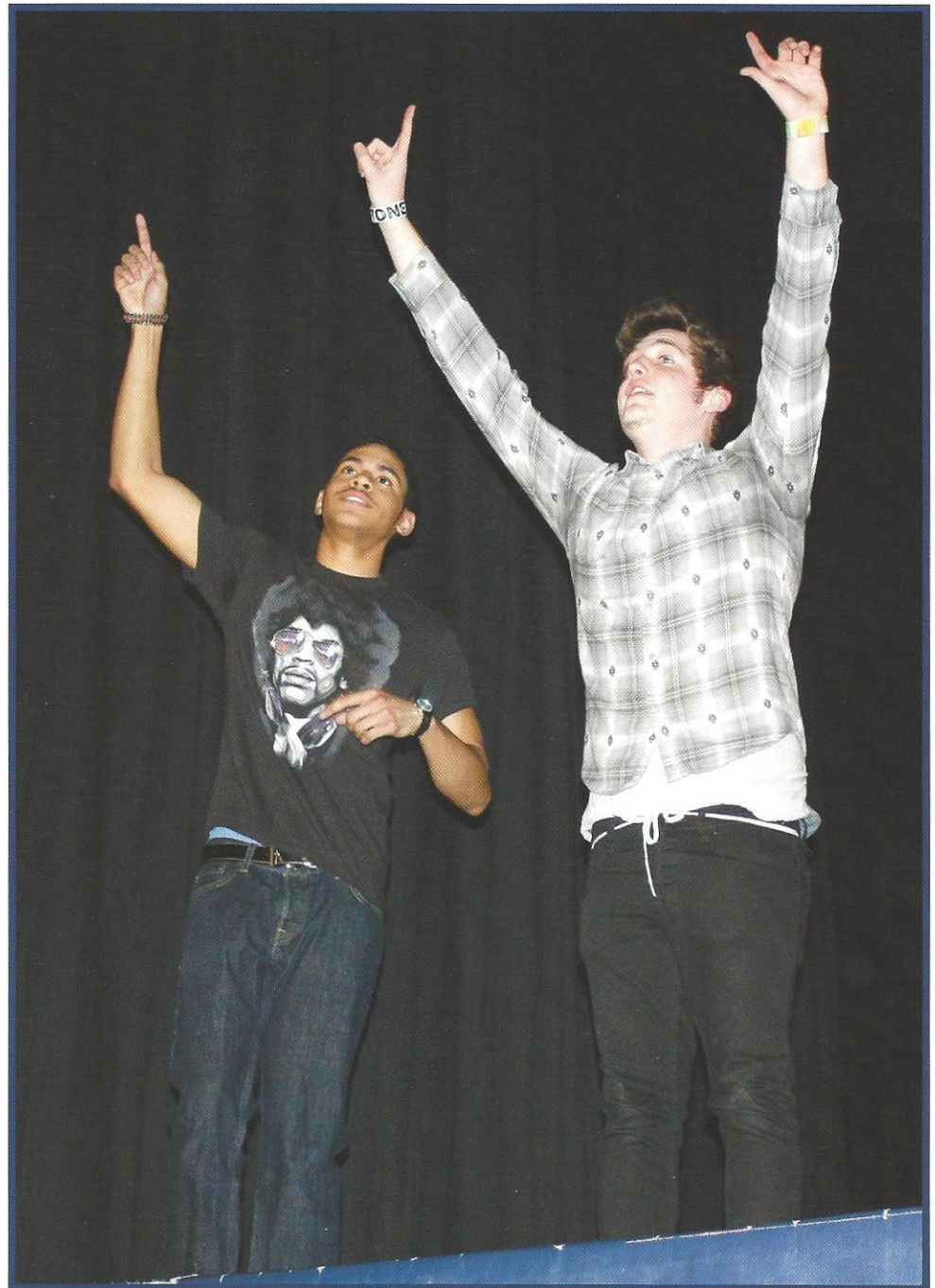
Music is a universal theme throughout our school. Every student marches to a different

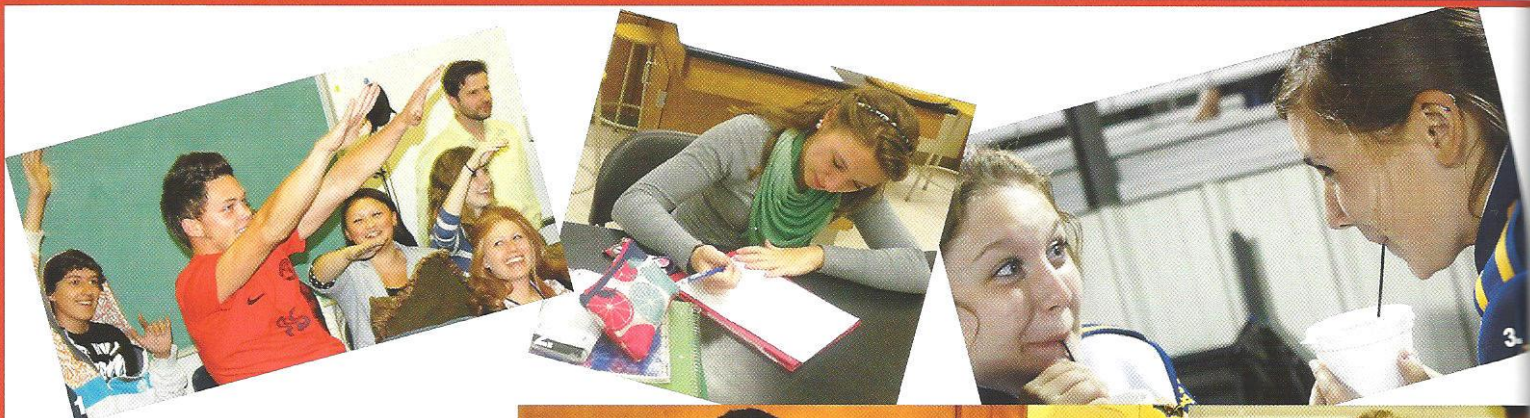

5. Prepping her vocals for the upcoming High School Rock Off at the House of Blues, is junior Maddie Oslejsek, in seventh period songwriting.

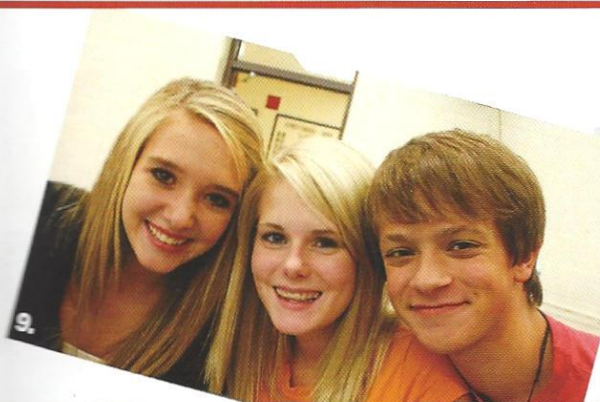

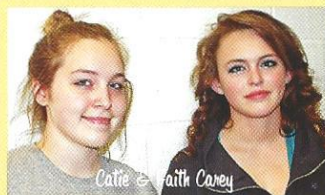
Band keeps tune with Rowdies

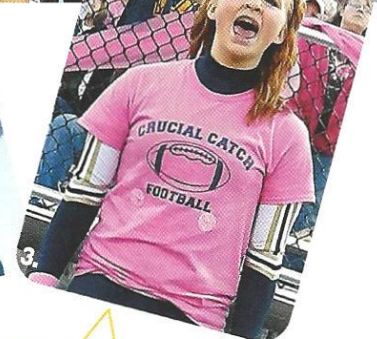
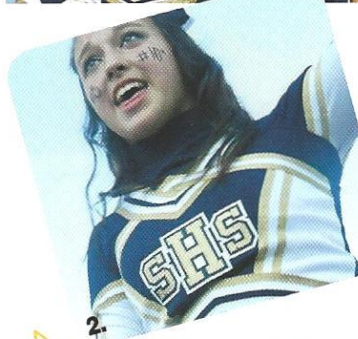
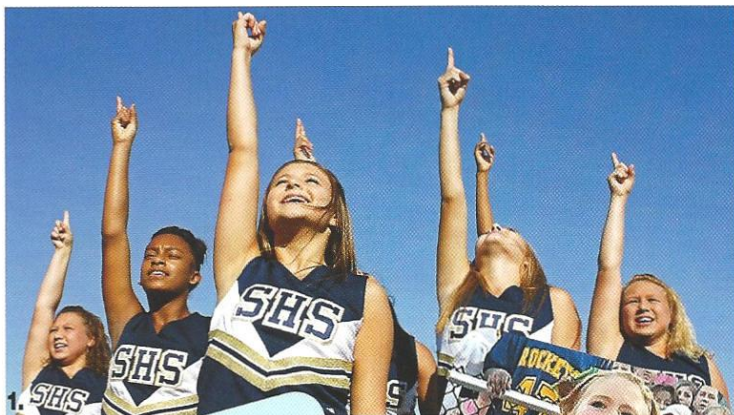
Sophomore gymnasts dominate squads

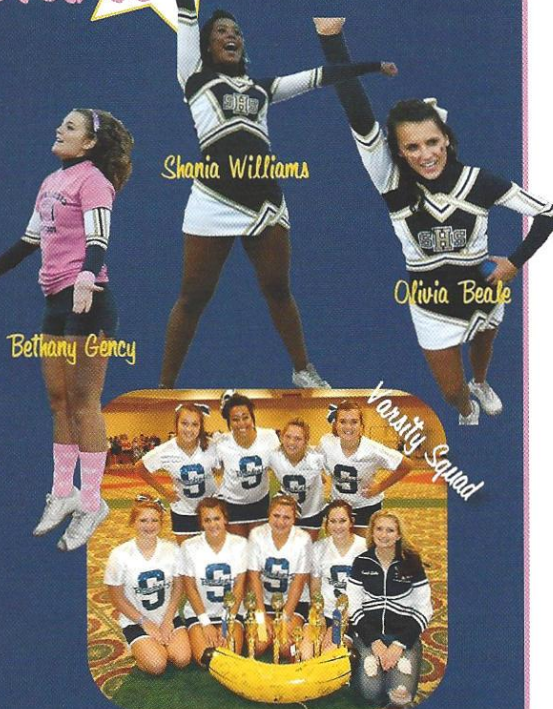

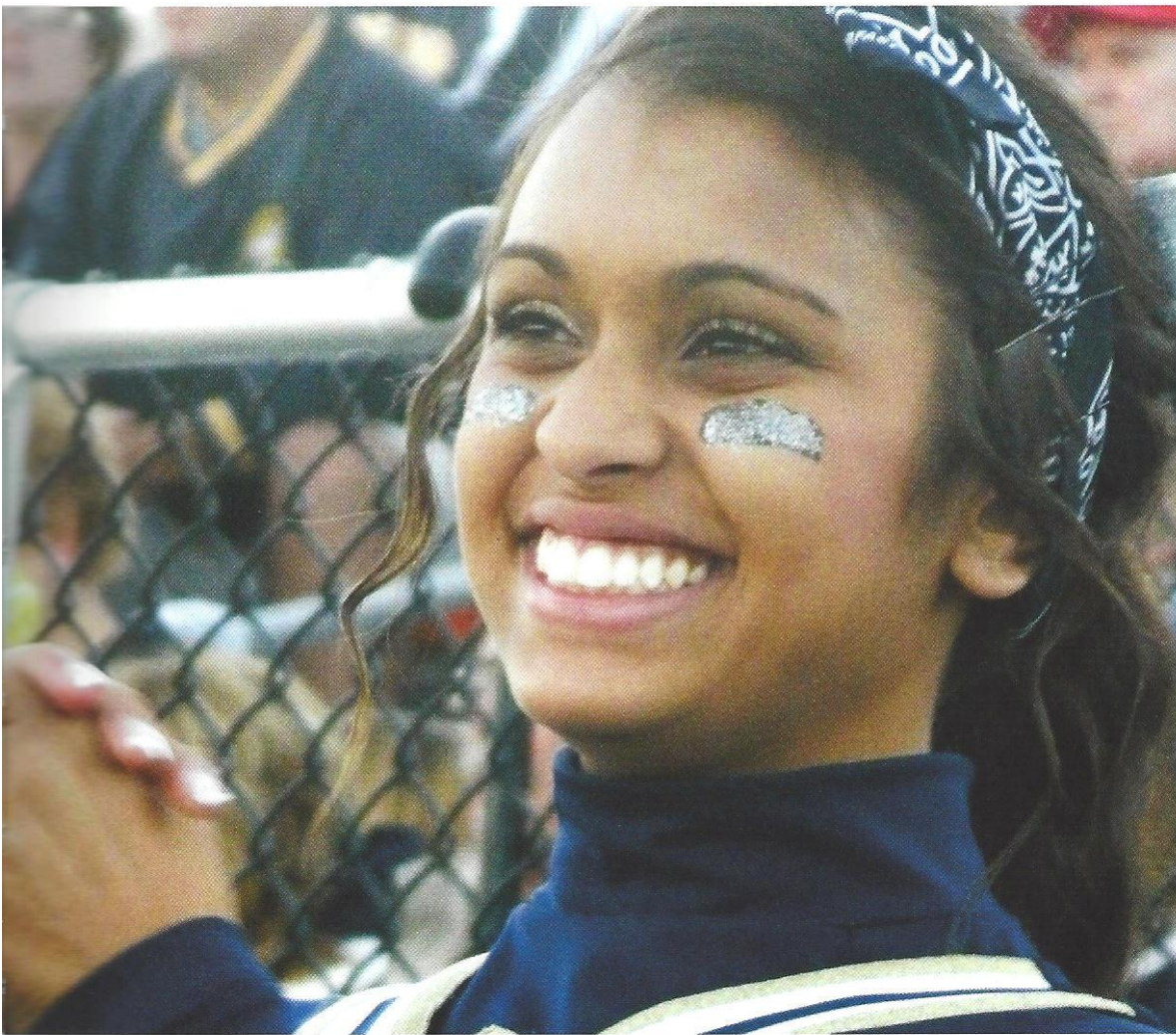


All Stars

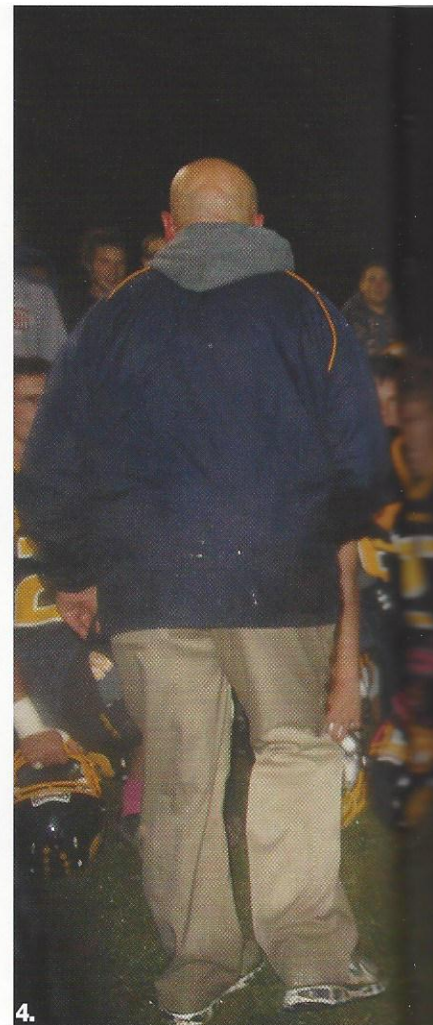
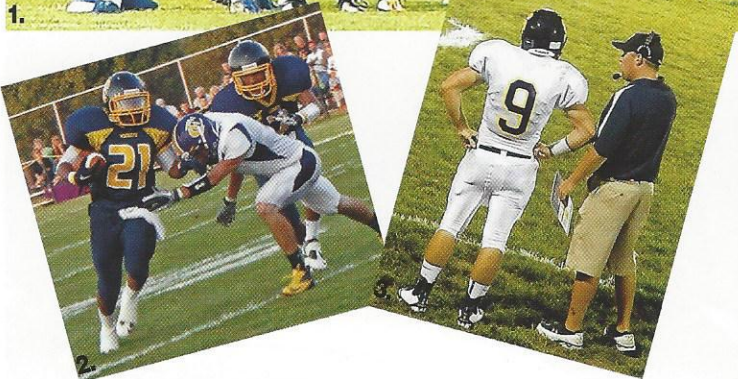
Rockets rock their way to state playoffs

Sophomore Jake Gould sets new course record

1. Running his first cross country meet ever in the McDonald Invitational is sophomore

Tyler Garman. He placed 81 among 235 runners and second on his team with a time of 21:26. "I ran track in seventh, eighth and ninth grade, but never cross country,"

Garman said. "I just started this year... I started running because my family was really pushing me to play a fall sport...it was either cross country or golf, and I loved running track, so I decided to give cross country a shot...I'm glad I did."

2. Pacing himself on his way to mile two of 3.1 at the Boardman Invitational September

15 is senior Austin Lesak. Beating his personal record, until Senior Night at home September 19, he finished the race with a time of 21:09. "I love being the only senior on the team," Lesak said. 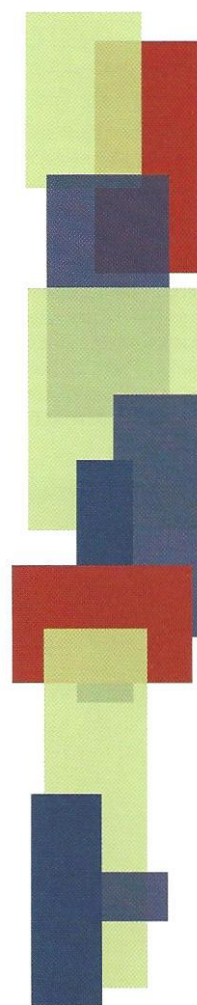

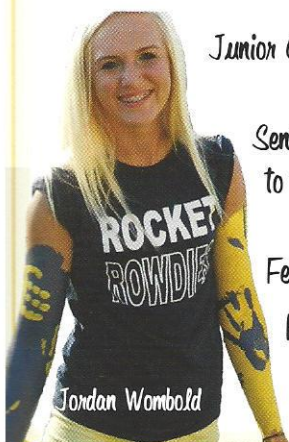


Paint Party

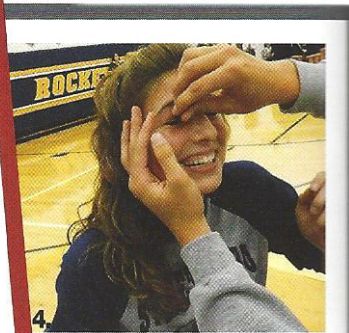
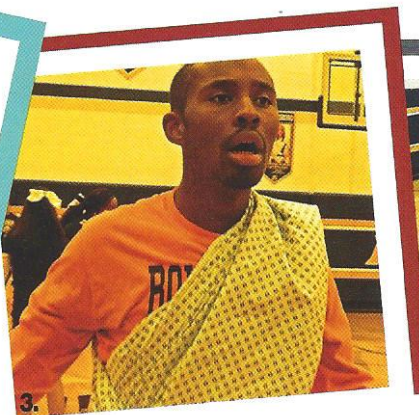
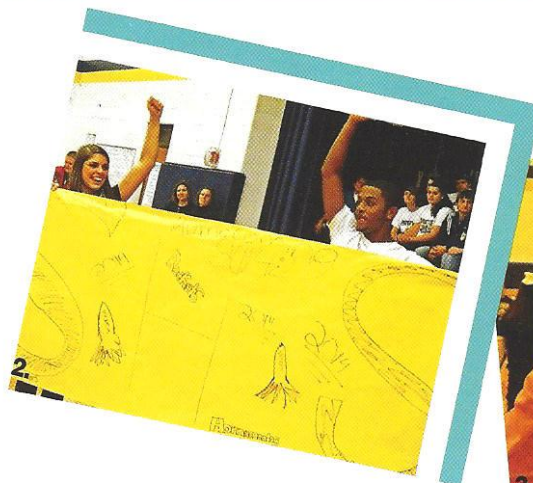
Assembly on Thursday, court presented at chilly game

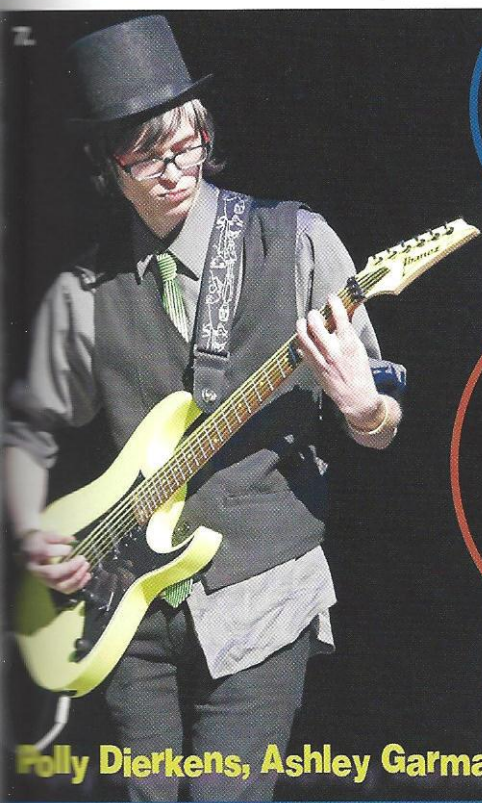
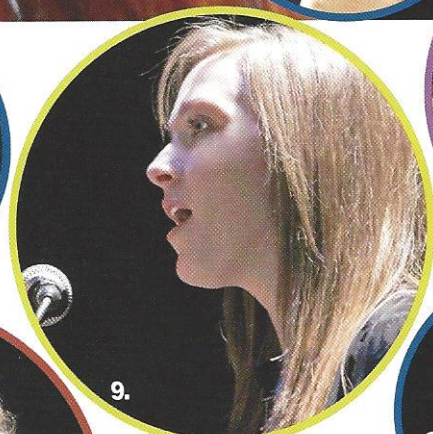
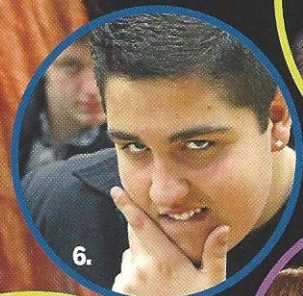
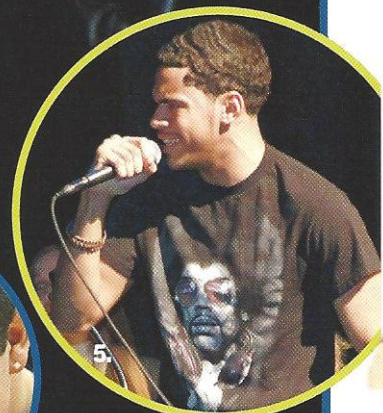
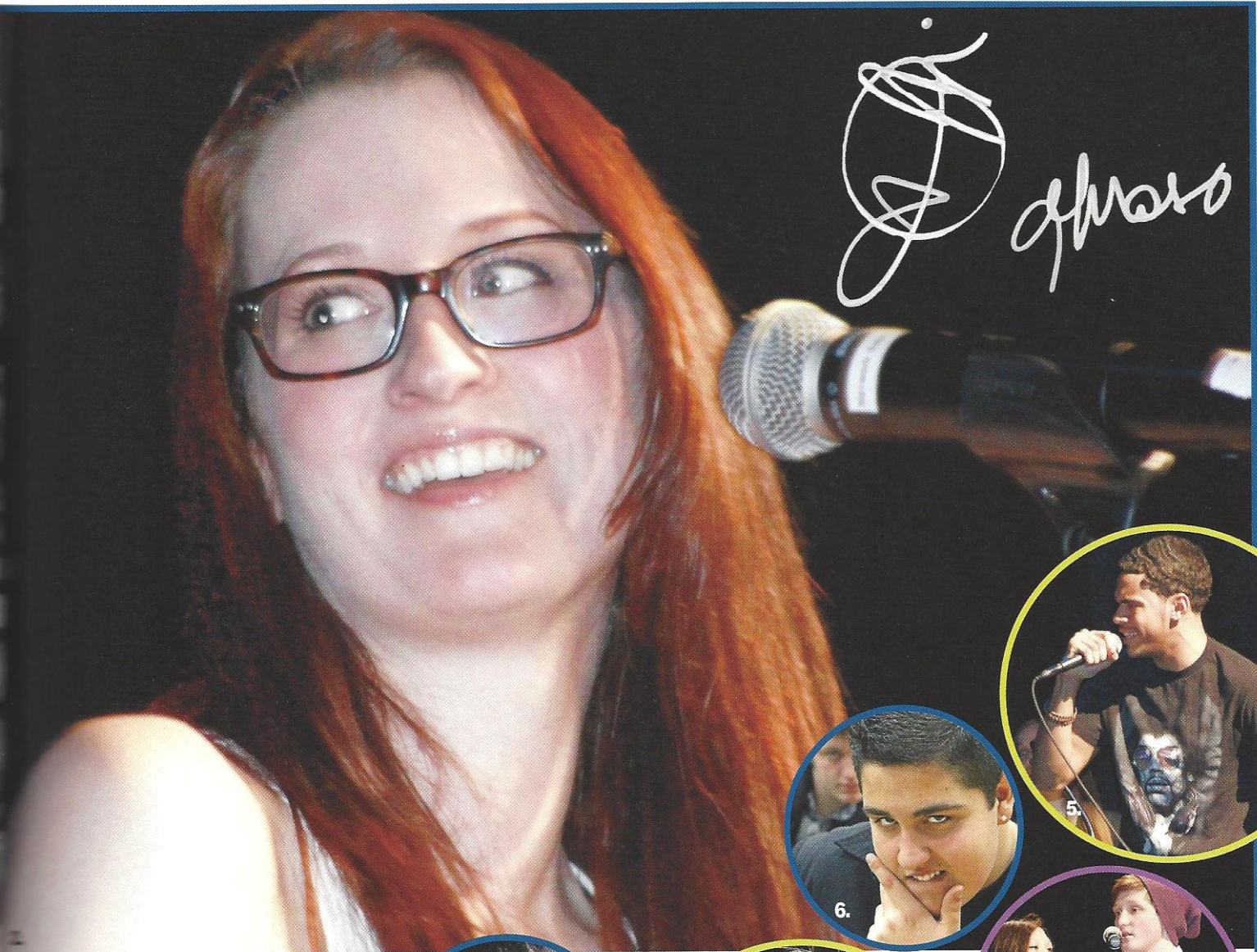
Class wins keyboard, chance to perform with professional indie-pop singer

"Every child should have the chance those students do to experience music at school, but with music budgets being cut, it's rare. The work that the VH1 Save The Music Foundation is doing will help put instruments in the hands of kids across the U.S. and I'm so thrilled to be able to help."

For the grand prize, SHS' songwriting class, taught by English teacher Jim Boardwine, won a Yamaha piano and a performance from Michaelson. The February 26 concert was the same day as junior Oslejsek's, 17th birthday. Many of Michaelson's songs have been featured on television, in the shows "Grey's Anatomy," "American Idol," "Parenthood," "The Vampire Diaries" and "So You Think You Can Dance." She has sold 3.6 million singles on her own label, and ended up on the cover of Billboard Magazine as "the new paradigm" in the music industry. Her latest album, "Human Again," was her highest selling debut yet, reaching number one on iTunes and Top Five on the Billboard sales chart in its first week.

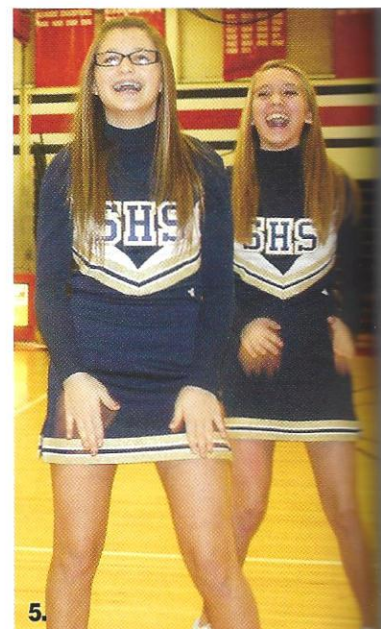
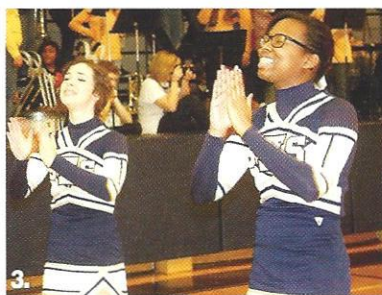

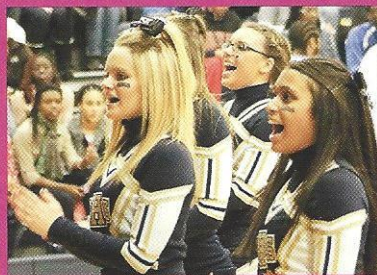

Matusik advances in national three-point contest

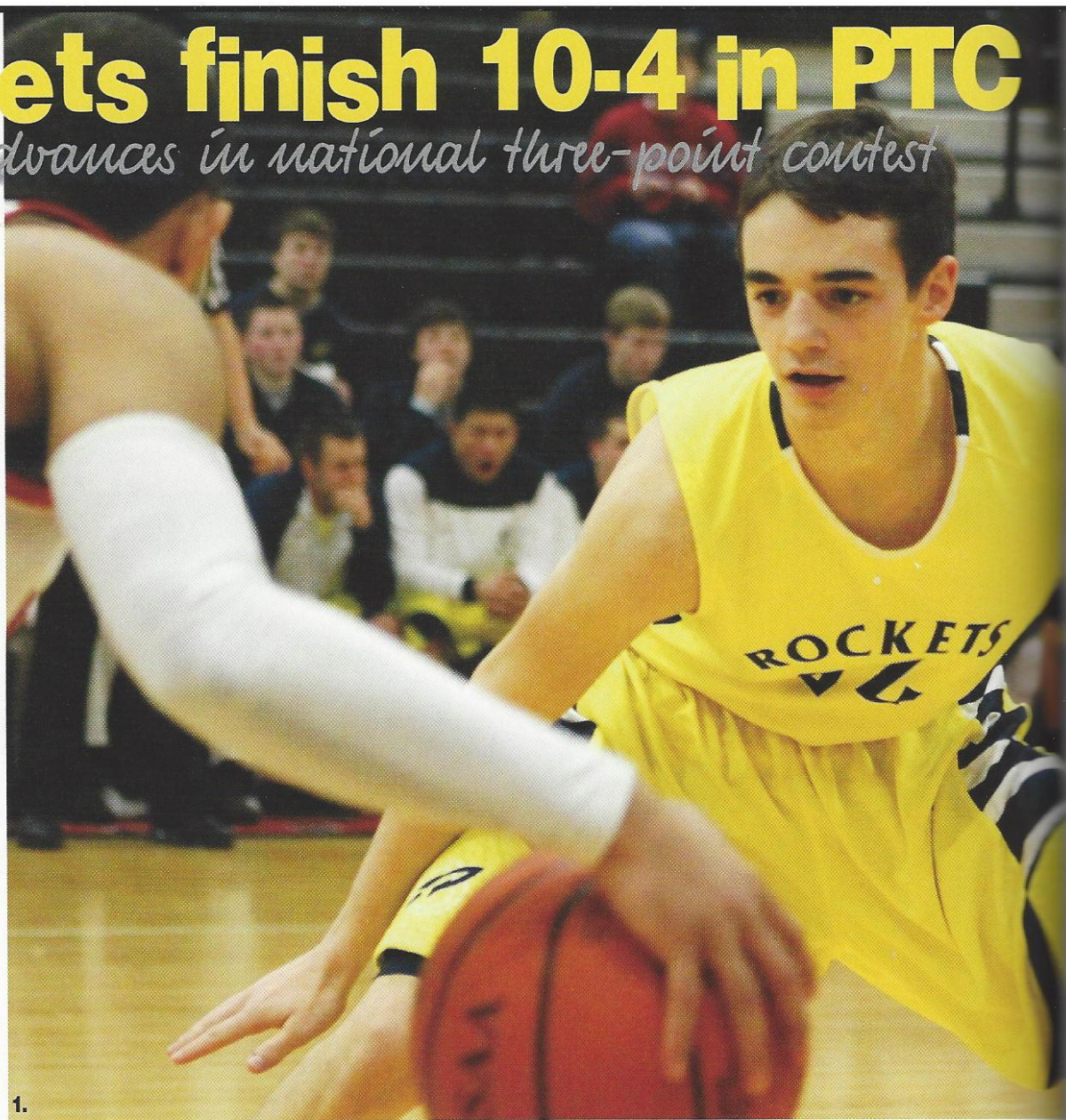

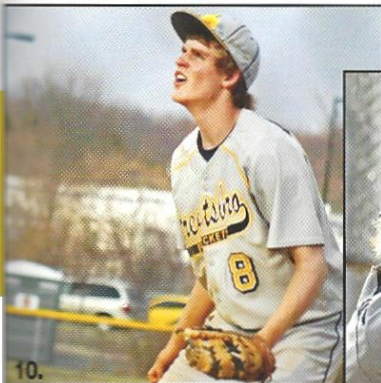

Team finishes 5th of 16 at districts

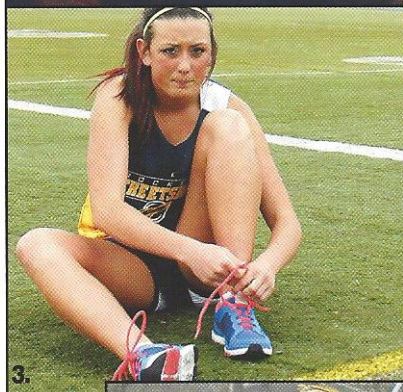

The Golden Key yearbook was produced by the yearbook staff at Streetsboro High School in Streetsboro, Ohio, and printed by Jostens, Inc. Larry Intihar serviced the account and Andrew Buhler provided technical assistance. Produced using Jostens Yeartech

Online on classroom PCs as well as various individuals' laptops, layouts were submitted to the plant via yearbookavenue.

The cover concept was developed by the yearbook staff and Jostens artist Sherry Mann. Mann created the design in Adobe Photoshop CS5. It incorporated a precision-cut lithoscreening on 150-point binders board. The endsheets were printed on Silver Sheen 877. The book's 148 full-color pages are printed on 100# premium gloss. All body copy was set in 8-point Ebony. Primary headlines were written in Firewalk, centered, and required to be at least 40-point type. Secondary headlines are in AYT Renatta Handrawn. Colors used on the spreads were pulled out of photos on each one. Photos were taken with two classroom Canon cameras as well as various staff members' personal cameras. (Shout out to senior Austin Lesak for loaning out his awesome new Canon so we could take better shots!) Students used Adobe Photoshop CS3 to crop and edit most photos. Professional portraits were provided by Ohio School Pictures, Venditti Studio (sports) J. Michael Photography and various other photographers chosen by individual seniors. The 160 sold copies of the book ranged from \$60-\$80, depending on when they were ordered.

Why music for this year's theme? The students and staff of Streetsboro High School make up a unique family. Though each person dances to the beat of his/her own drum, we are all tied together by a common interest: music. Music is a part of everyone's life in some way or another.
