














Despite eight calamity days, school activities heat up








Coach resigns after season ends























Eighteen students and adviser Polly Dierkens met during sixth period – and any other time they were able to fit it into their schedules – to put together this 160-page yearbook in Room 302.

Since seniors filled 17/18 positions on the staff, they were constantly looking back and reflecting on their earlier high school years. After searching Pinterest, the group debated between the memories theme and another involving travel/destination. Then, at the fall Jostens' yearbook conference at Lakeland Community College, senior Daman Singh sketched a cover graphic featuring a lock, prompting the class to favor the memories theme. Senior Shania Williams then created a design for the title page, but the class loved it enough to make it the cover.

Blue and gold were pulled out of the photos via Adobe Photoshop for the custom litho cover, which features process color 317 and shine FX. The theme, "Locked in 2015 Memories" is carried out through headlines, content of the Q &A and in the alternative copy.

The 8.5x11 book was created using Jostens' online "Yearbook Avenue" program. Primary headlines are 48 pt. Genuine, with the secondary heads in 32 pt. Cursive Hand. Captions are 10 pt. Chantilly, with the first word of each highlighted in all caps and a coordinating color. Photo credits are in 10 pt. bold, AYT Albert, matching the color of the first word. (AYT Albert is also the font used for alternative copy on fall sports pages.) Subjects of COBs are identified in Genuine 8 pt. COBs were created via yearbook avenue's "Effects" and/or in Adobe Photoshop. Photoshop was also used to crop and edit the lighting on many of the pictures. Photos were shot using the three classroom Canon T3 Rebels, and various other cameras staffers owned/borrowed. Venditti Studio took the posed sports team photos. Lifetouch handled the majority of the portraits, though seniors were permitted to submit shots taken by other photographers.

The basic book was on sale for \$60 until September 15, \$65 until Thanksgiving, increased to \$70 through March 31 and finally sold for \$75.

Jostens rep Larry Intihar helped inspire, motivate and try to push an eggshell color for the endsheets. (It didn't work!). With the help of plant consultant Joy Woomer, Mrs. D. and the class completed pages in record time, despite the year's challenges and distractions. A new principal at the helm led to changes such as no powder puff game, eventful class meetings on the schedule, and the re-introduction of a talent show. The page ladder had to be revamped numerous times, and the staff had no choice but to be flexible. Schedule changes following the first semester turned an initial three boys on staff into senior Kyle Bish as the "last man standing." Despite drama, technology challenges, and eight snow days, the class came together to critique/revise each other's pages to make sure everyone was happy with the end product. They accomplished this in the midst of frantic studying for anatomy, watching Kid President and the Weingart wedding videos, constant selfies, senior Maddie Rogowski answering the phone like a secretary and repeatedly knocking over Mrs. Dierkens' seashells, and everybody listening to "Shut Up and Dance" by Walk the Moon.
