













Portage County's leader of the past, WSTB, not only got a brand new look this year, but also a new station manager. Stepping into fill Steve Foltin's shoes is Bob Long, formerly of WKNT. Along with him came alot of changes for Streetsboro's local radio station, such as an updated format to give the station a fresh look and broadening the scope of the broadcasting class to include training in the television media. The old WSTB logo got a new look this year too- Associate News Director Ray Veon, in cooperation with Bob, drew and designed the new logo incorporating the revamped "Sound of Gold" format into it. The station also switched news networks. to bring the upbeat RKO News into the WSTB fold.

One of the highpoints this year was WSTB's coverage of general election night in November. News Director Chris Adkins and Program Director Jim Michniak, with juniors Lee Myers and Herb Gilespie, were stationed at election headquarters, informing the audience of election returns as they came in. Meanwhile, stationed back at the studio, Jim Bado and Rick Boardwine kept the show going throughout the night, assisted by Ray Veon's various political commentaries. Although most of the crew was up till 3:00 a.m., all their hard work paid off-WSTB was

the first radio station in the county to broadcast the final election returns.


Looking To The Future








Student Council





Orbiter Does It Again


News Flash:




Yearbook . . .


Wrestling







Dave Rupp Orbiter Artist

Sophomore Dave Rupp, in his first year on the Orbiter staff, has quickly established himself as a very talented artist.
