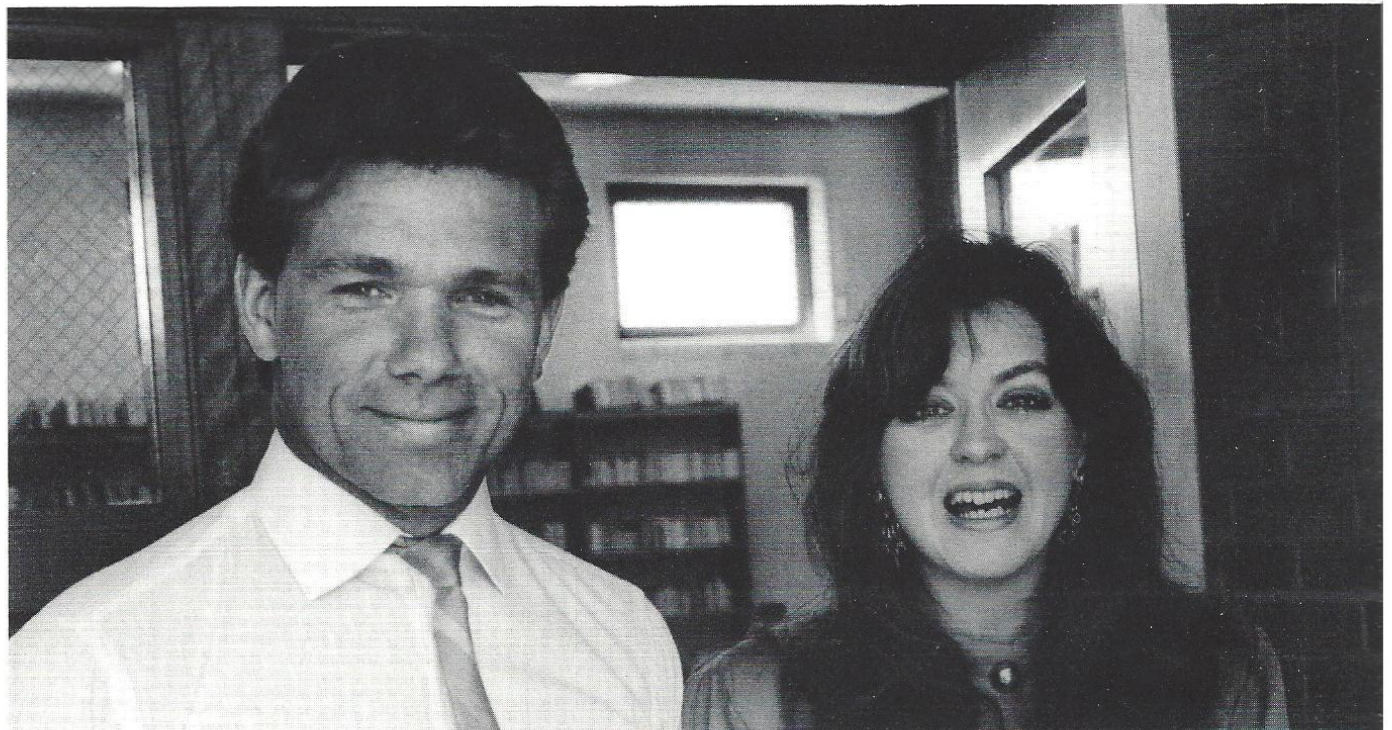
Celebrate!

Senior Kim Hydash said, "I don't want to graduate and move out because I will miss my parents support. I don't want to be a failure!"

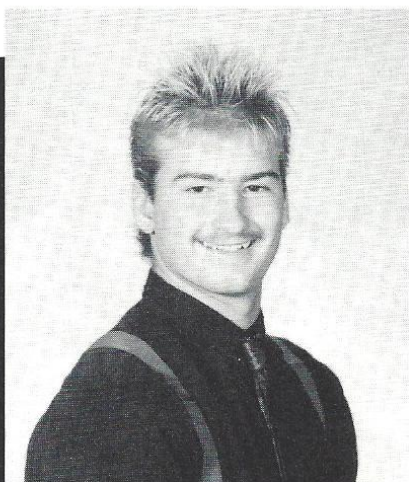

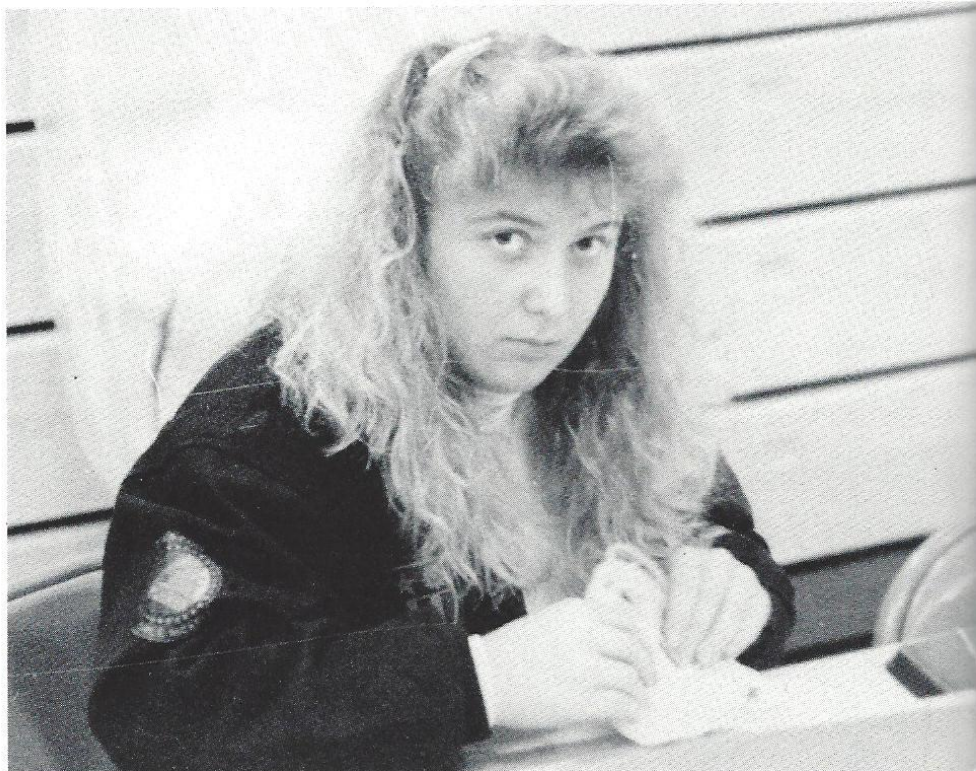


Student Council motivates, leads school into the next decade

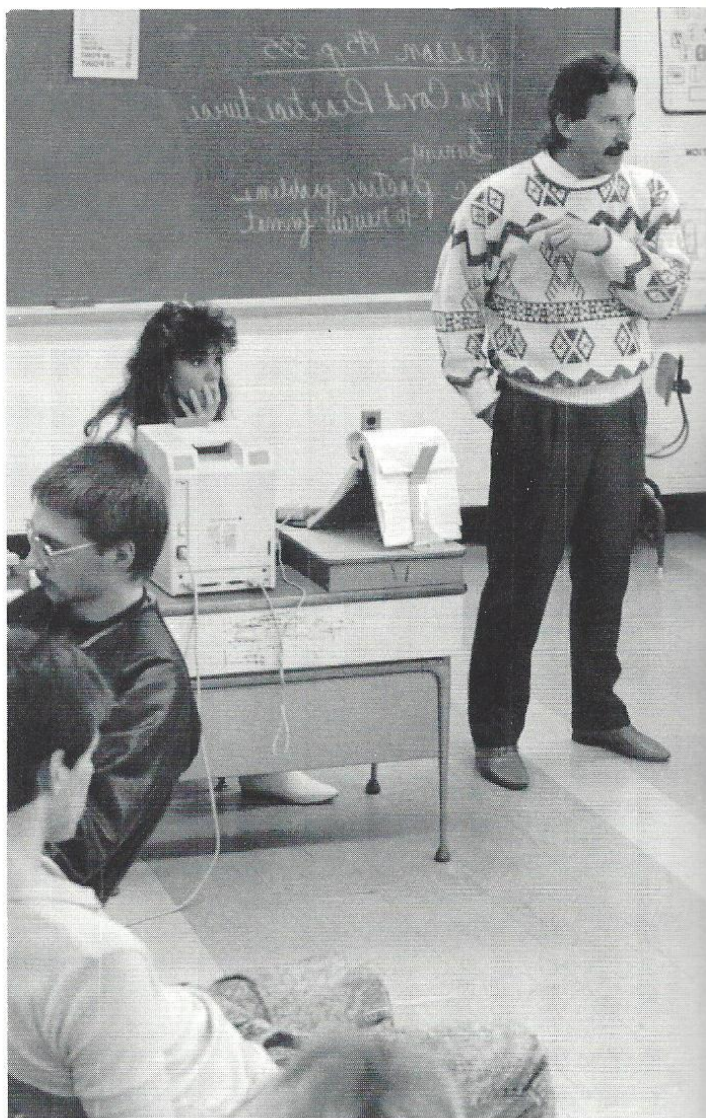


Stop the presses!

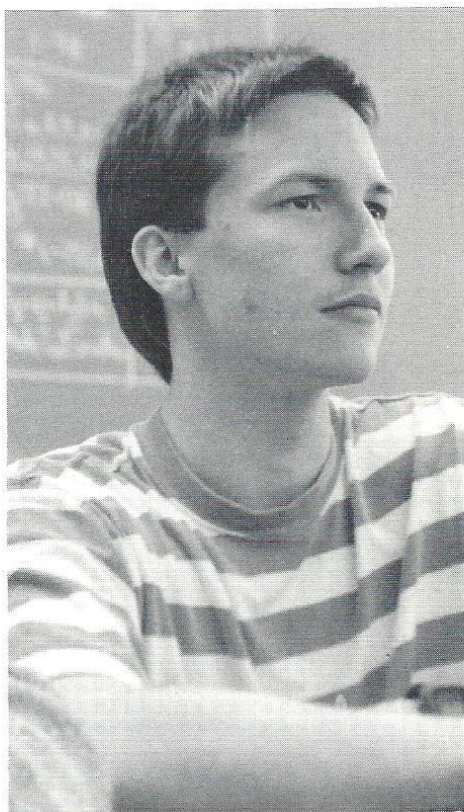

"We had a great season with the team placing third in the PCL. I am really glad that we placed so high in the league and improved our skills since last year," said **Brown**.

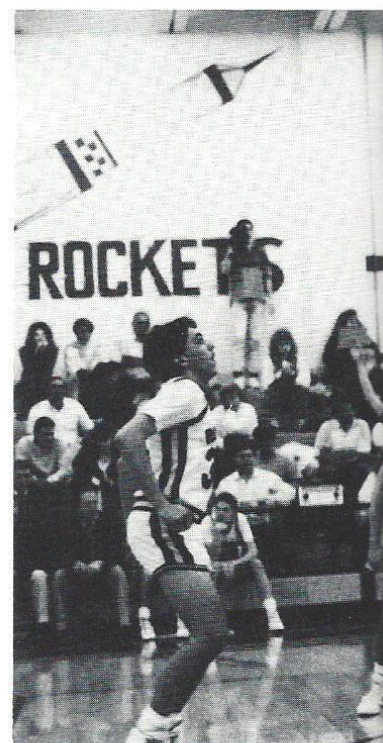
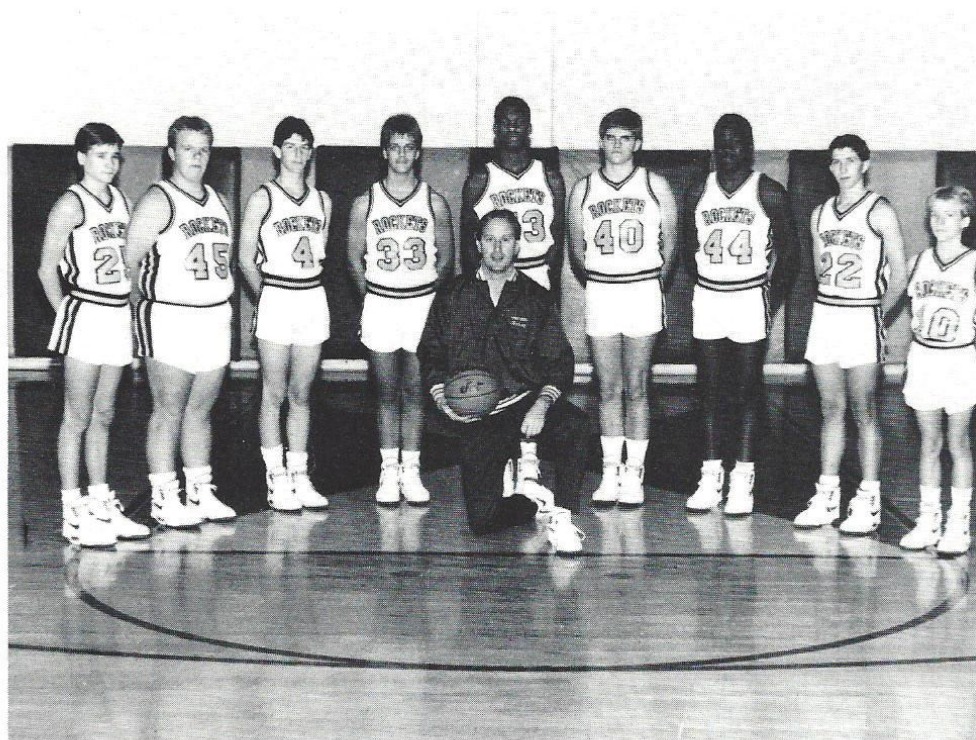

"I feel that the season went well although I felt we could have won more games," said Coach Creamer.

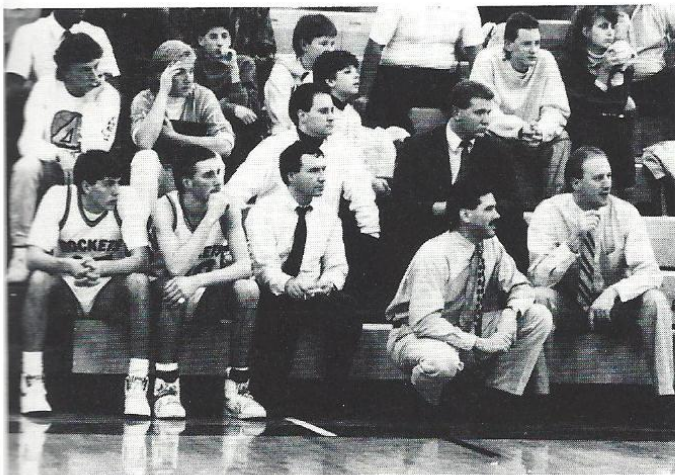

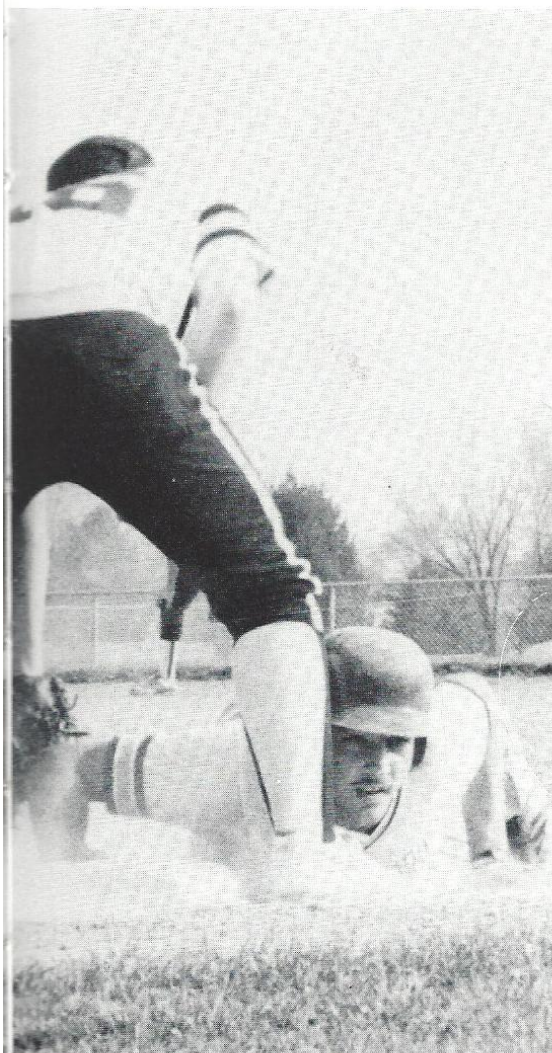

"This season was a fun season for me, compared to the last 5 years. As for next year, we need everybody to come back out," said Coach Dave Hostetler.





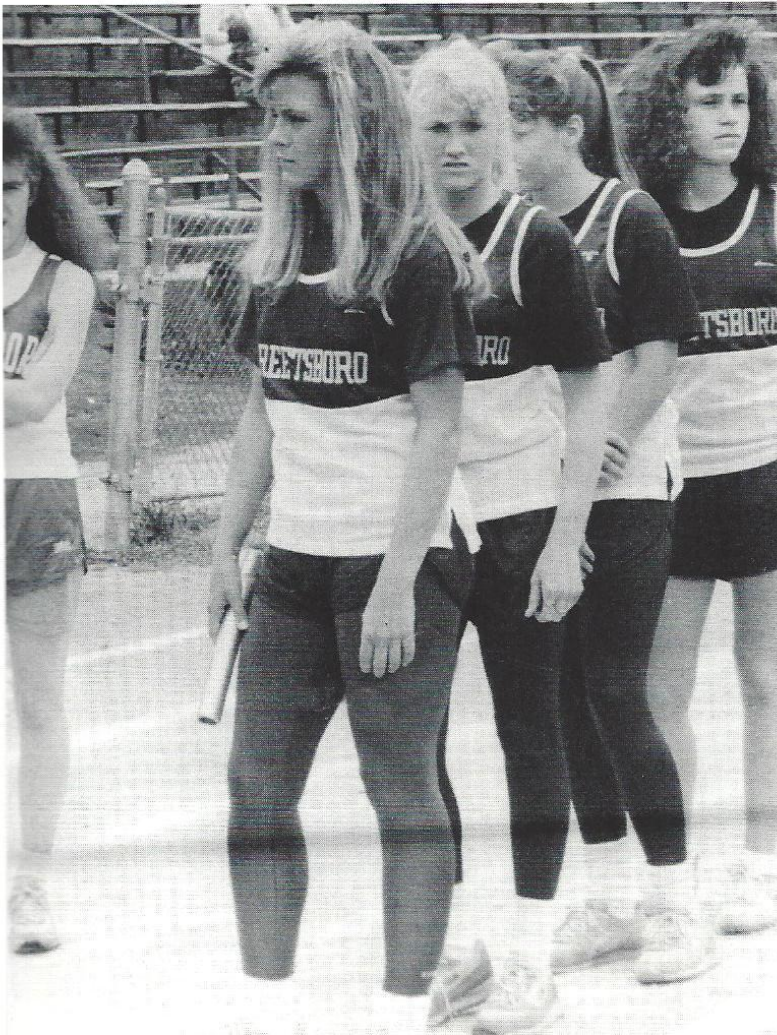

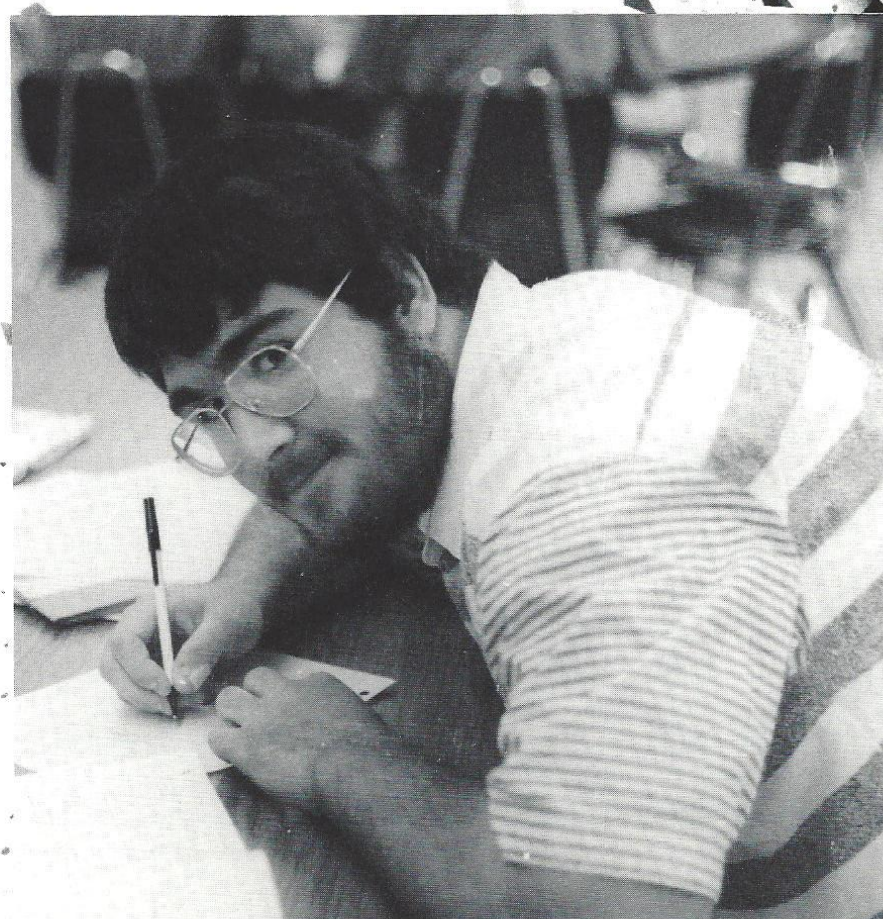
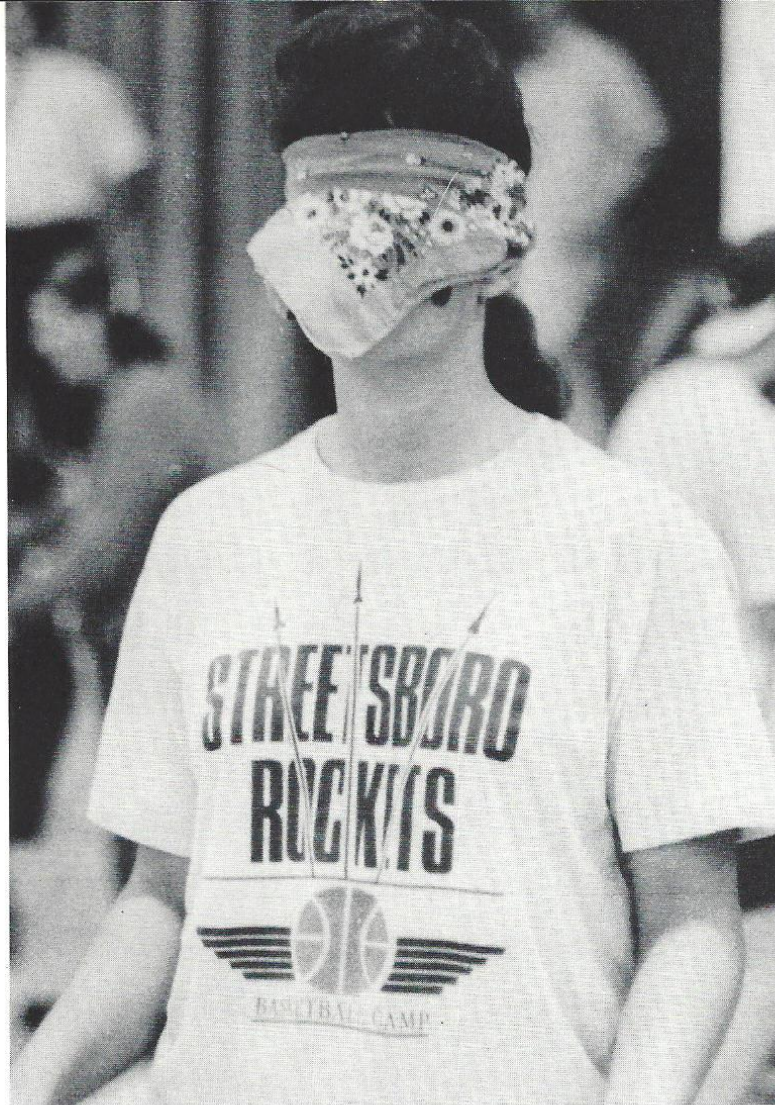
Tina Riffle made the All-League softball team at second base, while Troyer once again was named to the second team. **Michelle Winters** and **Tammy Riffle** made

Student council has fundraising activities so they can afford to continue to put on activities. Student council also has entertaining events for the school to watch and participate in.

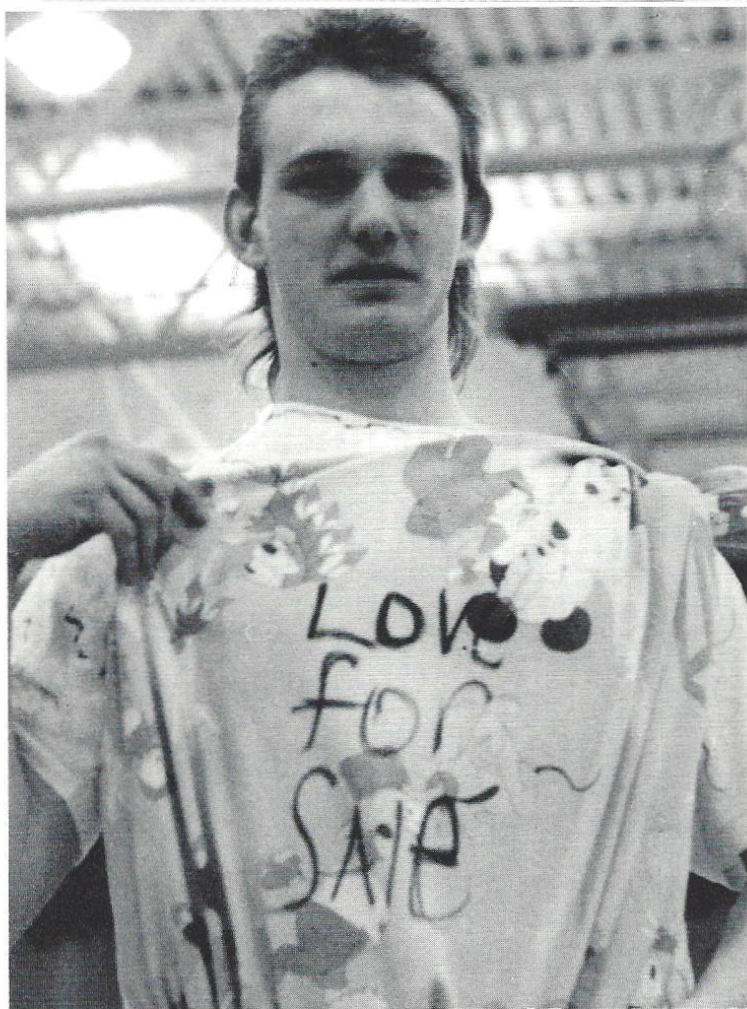

The cover is a Vista Lithox non-woven material in white with all elements in four-color process with gold foil. It is mounted on 120 point binder's board.

The endsheets are school designed in black ink on rose paper stock.

The book is Smyth-sewn in 16 page signatures, trimmed to 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$, rounded and backed, with head and foot bands.

All captions and body copy are done in 8 and 10 point Times Roman using capitalization as the emphasis type face. Heads appear in 18, 30, and 48 point Times Roman Bold and Italic.
