He received a full scholarship to Harvard University and graduated in 1971 and to my knowledge, the only student from Streetsboro School System to be admitted to Harvard College in the over 100 years of the Streetsboro School System's existence.

He was named a "Harvard National Scholar" (top 2% of his class).

Ed graduated 1975 from Columbia Law School and been practicing law for 45 years.

He has been involved in over 300 class action lawsuits involving billions of dollars

He's had a case in all 50 states in the Country, including Alaska and Hawaii.

His largest recovery in a case = \$140,000,000.

He, as lead investor, took over the CFBank and, since then, has tripled the size of the bank.

He has invested in over 20 companies in the Cleveland area—always providing employment to this area.
